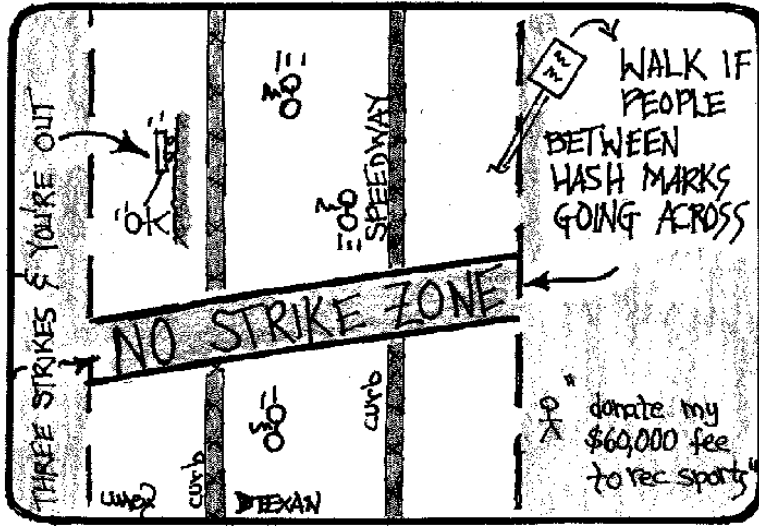

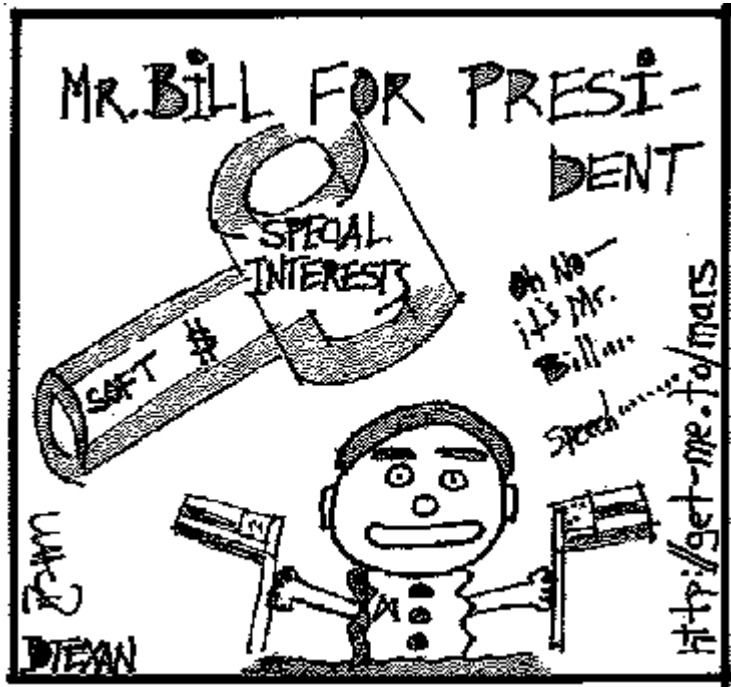

Government

We live in a technical society. **All of the technical rules and regulations are made by anonymous organizations funded by Big Business.** They constantly lobby to increase the cost and complexity of everything from electrical wiring in your house to the structural integrity of your automobile. They use safety as an excuse to make things more expensive for us all. This is done completely out of sight, of even the U.S. Congress; which, after all, is made up almost exclusively of lawyers. Special interests and political action groups have become the new pillars of the establishment in Washington. The general public seems content, and Congress is content - so why not just make it official and save everybody some tax money and increase the profits of corporations and the dividends

of stockholders. That can be done easily enough by just outlawing all soft money contributions, and just giving everybody's vote a weight proportionate to their wealth. Why not just give them the power they have already, and stop taxing the rest of us to hide their subterfuge behind a mind numbing facade of rules and regulations. Does nobody assume humankind is evolving, or different, or responsible? A federalist government can allow each state to develop its own program, say for Welfare - with little oversight. Then a few years later the federalist government can evaluate the **fifty state programs**, determine which is most effective and establish that program as a new standard. Then let the states go their own way, and so forth. This gives each region the freedom to determine it's best destiny, while benefiting from the experience from all the others. They should use the latest technology - retina scans, digital fingerprinting, and in some cases DNA testing - to attain the highest possible level of security. If the government uses enough of these devices the price may come down enough to where industry can use them too. That's how the modem got started - the military paid billions to create it, then gave it to Rockwell for nothing so they could make trillions in instant profit.

We need an **Amendment** taking Social Security out of reach of Congress, under any circumstances, for ever. Just put it as an add on clause to the

ban on gay marriages; legalizing any immigrant in America over a week; and across the board amnesty for the Bush Administration's role in fantasizing about Weapons of Mass Destruction in Iraq.

Clearly Washington is controlled by special interests. They want outsourcing of jobs. So, Congress wants outsourcing. The only way out is for states to assert their constitutional rights. California has the 5th largest economy in the world. If they take actions to keep good jobs in California, there's not a damn thing Washington can do about it - not in an election year. **My advice to people is to contribute their money to your state and local politicians.** Money donated to any national campaign is totally wasted, unless you're somebody like Bill Gates ~ who actually gets everything he wants without contributing a penny to anybody.

The real question is why industry is sending so many jobs overseas. Industry knows this, and is sending the jobs away. The writing is on the wall for the rest of America too. With the Gulf Stream gone, far less moisture will go up the Atlantic Coast. The climate will be colder, too. Tobacco won't grow in Virginia; cotton in Georgia; or citrus fruits in Florida. Much more moisture will drench the Gulf Coast states. The Texas citrus zone will be too wet, and any trade along the whole coast will be prohibitively expensive. This will strangle the prosperity of inland areas.

Most importantly, the extreme weather along the Gulf Coast - all the torrid energy hurricanes have to dissipate will all go straight into the Gulf - will make drilling for oil virtually impossible. **So the major oil companies are furiously trying to extract every last drop while they still can.** Likewise for points inland, in Louisiana especially. The refineries in south Louisiana along the Mississippi in Baton Rouge will be useless too; as will the huge complex at Texas City near Houston. All these chemical and petrochemical facilities are being allowed to slump into total disrepair because the payback on regular maintenance is getting less and less profitable.

Why is industry being so obvious about outsourcing of jobs, in at best tentative economic conditions? Their model of business conditions takes into account the fact that **the Maryland sized block of ice that sluffed off of Antarctica two years ago,**

according to the best scientific models, should not have happened for 10,000 years. So, they fear, the Greenland icecap mishap could just as easily happen much sooner than later. Global competition is so fierce that a calamity of that scale, in the drastic affect it would have upon their American industries, could very well put a company out of business. It's better to err on the cautious side and move the jobs now while it can be done at a measured pace.

The ironic part is that the error in the Antarctic ice cap model was introduced by the absence of the ozone layer, which allows high energy UV rays to impact Earth from the sun. There is no ozone hole over the north pole, so that error will not happen. However, industry is so paranoid about the whole Freon issue - their \$1 trillion taxation without representation upon the civilized world, especially America - that they won't even acknowledge the ozone layer is a problem at all. Again, they err on the cautious side, keep the lid on the Freon fiasco, and go about their ugly business.

The recent campaign finance laws have created a massive new loophole for corporate America. Several massive media consultants have raised \$250 million for the Democratic cause, and **they are using this money to pay for wall to wall advertising on - guess what - radio and TV stations they already own.** So major corporate contributors around the nation ante up, giving the media even more ready cash to buy even more broadcast outlets to gain an even stronger monopoly on the media. So much for freedom of speech.

Washington's leading politicians are in the habit of buying American's votes with tax cuts. A tax cut now will only pump more money into the economy, forcing it to heat up even faster than the ultra low interest rates are starting to cause. Woe is me, but how will Washington win now - except by wholesale advertising to a nation prepped to be easily brainwashed by a whole social system that has custom made our collective psyche. They have always known they had this ultimate power, but never had reason to use it until now.

This trend toward kidnappings of civilians in Iraq has sent a clear signal to every law maker in the world. If you're tough on terrorism, you will face the consequences. Most members of Congress are only there for a term or two, after which time they are fair game. The premier of Red China recently gave a news conference announcing they had to slow down their economy - week old news; then this afternoon the Bush Administration announced it would not address concerns for workers in China submitted by a petition from the AFL-CIO. **They said such an investigation, even if it revealed problems, would only lead to economic isolationism - a path the U.S. will not take.** Thus, by definition, they will support a lowering of wages in America to compete with the Chinese. Ultimately, China will peg the worldwide standard for wage earners, bringing every worker in the world down to their level - because nobody anywhere can compete with a billion dirt cheap laborers. Clearly Bush is nostalgic for his youthful days in China where, as son of the American ambassador, he was a member of the supreme elite in China - miles above even powerful Communist Party members.

Were somebody such as myself to come forward and say all these things to Congress, the very first thing they would do is refer the matter to counsel and tap their consultant and special interest lobby friends for their input. Technology

Virtually **every major technological objective** of the modern era has failed: the superconducting supercollider, the "Star Wars" missile defense, the joint task force fighter, and dozens more. All these projects are classified out of reach, of everybody. A good 85% of ALL research, anywhere, on any topic is now classified. **How the hell is a graduate student able to find a good research project if he doesn't have security clearance, and nobody will say what's already been done?** I think it's just like the NY Times bestseller said, **Science is at an End** because all the fundamentals are classified, or proprietary, or otherwise out of reach of those who can advance the state of the art ~ young people, with no clearance, and not enough history to get a high level security clearance. **We might as well shut down all the Universities right now**, at least the research laboratories because their usefulness is at an end. Scientists can't worship that book as a pioneering work of fiction, and keep their cushy jobs at the same time. Sorry boys and girls, **the Happy Days are over.**

One of President Clinton's last major incentives was to get \$1 trillion appropriated for repair of schools around the nation - mostly mechanical and structural repairs (EXCLUDING the \$1 trillion in

new equipment needed to comply with the dubious Freon Ban). This was needed just to get the buildings up to the 1990 Building Code. The cost is likely two times that now. **So, while the scientific community was building \$3 trillion of projects that never panned out; the public schools were going in the red to the tune of \$3 trillion.** We owe it all to the enormous influence of teacher's special interest groups in Washington. Shame on me for saying that. But it's true.

Then there is the case of the **Israeli Defense Forces**. For decades they have taken the best American technology - jets, missiles, armaments - and improved upon it, creating all together the most sophisticated arsenal in the world. The problem is that they do not share ANY of their technology back with the United States. It's an insult for our largess to be spurned so arrogantly. We owe it to them, because of the Holocaust ~ how much longer will they play that card? The Jews complain about Christians blaming them for Christ's demise; then wonder why Christians think lightly of the Holocaust? Neither party is being the least bit objective, and probably never will - until the whole world is Islam, and it's too late for diversity. Of course, by that point in time Islam won't even be recognizable, what after all the new age modernizations and revisions to the Koran like they've done to the Bible.

Americans invest enormous sums into our **institutions of higher education**. Over eighty percent of all basic research in the world is done on American university campuses. The American people fund all that, but most of the benefit goes to all the other nations in the world. We spend all our money and manpower on fundamental research; they spend all theirs on practical applications. The classic example is Japan - they do virtually no basic research; but have the most sought after cars and electronics in America. Their products are cheap - even after shipping them around the world - because they have no research and development overhead to pay for; just technological innovation. Americans were always good thinkers but lousy businessmen. We make great bombs but never drop them at a good time.

The crafts - carpentry, mechanics, and such - are not normally categorized as technology; but they are vital to the development of advanced technology nonetheless. The famous naval historian Alfred Mahan wrote that the South lost the Civil War because they did not have enough people in the trades. Increasingly, America is becoming the same way because of **cheap migrant labor**. The American construction industry has become dangerously addicted

to this cheap labor; and the American work force has become seriously disassociated from the fundamental crafts because of it. "Made in America" is nothing more than an eroticism.

Macintosh marketed a new PC a couple of years ago that they advertised as having **dual processors**. The effective speed was doubled, but the incremental increase in cost was nil because older central processor chips are virtually worthless. I'm quite sure the entire computer industry would LOVE to keep increasing the costs of their PC's while just using two, then three, then four, etc.. paralleled chips. The technology is there - the aerospace industry can parallel hundreds of chips easily - and the greed as well. Just a few months ago the company that manufactures the machines that make chips announced a huge loss - while the rest of the industry was doing quite well - what more evidence do you need? They don't need new chip manufacturing machines if they're still making the same old Intel chips, now do they?

Science funding is a complex business. Congress funded the Hubble telescope, for example. Then they indirectly funded the thousands of scientists and their research projects who have made an entire industry of evaluating the data from the Hubble. The complete cost of the Hubble, then, is hundreds if not thousands times what the device itself cost. The same will probably happen with the data coming from the Mars survey missions. The American people need to reconsider their absolute trust in everything scientists say or do or think or plan. Jesus was the Son of God, and look how much the system trusted Him. We have no business treating the authorities any differently - do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

A couple of years ago tens of thousands of **high tech workers** were given visas to come work in the U.S. Now that the technology industry is suffering are those foreign workers being sent back home? NO. The immigration laws are being amended to make their resident status permanent. How much longer before they start deporting American citizens who are chronically unemployed? It makes perfect business since. Business has the power in Washington. The American people are totally ignorant of everything Washington does ~ Clinton's approval rating went up after he confessed to raping an underage intern in the White House.

Then there is the infamous **X-plane competition** last year, competed between Lockheed and Boeing. The Pentagon specified they create a vertical take off/landing aircraft like the Harrier. Yet,

even though this new X-plane is slated to become the jet aircraft of choice for all the military services in all applications, **the Harrier is currently used in at most 5% of combat operations.** Why have such a specialized aircraft be designed? The planes are extremely complicated mechanically, meaning they're a nightmare to maintain and cost a fortune to build. Maybe they're planning to let the Chinese steal the plans so they can use it for their manned mission to Mars.

The government isn't the only organization with the ability to invade our privacy. New micro miniature camcorders, cameras, wireless microphones, computer monitoring systems, GPS systems, and cell phone microwave intercept devices have given terrorists, crime syndicates, and drug runners all the tools they could ever hope for to expose undercover government operatives. The government must have court orders, paperwork, and product registration numbers. **The bad guys can just do it.** The odds are very much against the government now.

Every major terrorist event, no matter where it occurs in the world, rolls back the civil liberties of people everywhere - **one invisible baby step at a time.** Thinking individuals in democracies willingly sacrifice their freedoms for the comfort and security of old style totalitarianism. They are afraid of technology, mistrust it, and trust in their governments to allow them to live their lives out in relative security and prosperity.

Technology has driven progress and prosperity for three hundred years, since the industrial revolution. In the last century alone, the elderly have witnessed winged flight by aircraft, then jets, then space craft. The printing press gave way to typewriters, then word processors, then voice actuated computers. Bicycles gave way to motorcycles then powerful automobiles traveling on highly engineered roadways. Communication by mail took months via horseback; then weeks via roads; days via air carriers; now nanoseconds via email. Each of these steps, large or small, has been a boon to business.

No further such steps are on the horizon, or even visualized. All of the major technological incentives of recent years have failed miserably - nanotechnology, once a bright prospect that got billions in funding, is not practically a theoretical impossibility. **Space exploration is no less constrained by the extreme cost of escaping the grasp of Earth's gravitational pull.** Advances on the internet, once by orders of magnitude, now happen by fractions

of an inch. Faster computers are still built every day, but the need for them is diminishing. Cell phones offer instant communication with anybody in the world; you can't improve on that.

Business leaders recognize that the rate of innovation is lessening, and that the appetite of the general public for high tech items is peaking. **Profits will less and less be from technology innovations, but from opening up new markets in third world nations.** Already innovations are guarded by the industry giants with such extreme levels of secrecy that a minuscule security flaw in their software announced by Microsoft sends a wave of sheer panic through boardrooms the world around. Proprietary technology is what's kept Exxon-Mobil in business for decades, they recently claimed; and exhorted companies to create their own in house research labs to take advantage of the few technological crumbs that are left.

At the same time, there exists a near paranoia in the scientific community against any new, ground breaking ideas. Competition is so extreme for funding from a shrinking funding pool, and the ramifications of an embarrassing research flaw or failure are so extreme, that science goes forward like a snail across a bed of salt. Any esteemed scientist who dares to comment on this fact - like the folks leaving Sodom and Gomorrah - will themselves be turned into a pillar of salt, on the spot. **There is no secret guarded with greater fear anywhere in the world than the secret that scientific progress is grinding to a halt.** The slightest whiff of a rumor that this is the case, uttered by the most tremulous of insiders under the most dubious of circumstances, would crater the funding and the future of every scientist and every institution of higher education on the planet. An important part of being an authority is having absolutely no objections from your peers on anything you say. **Any such talk diminishes the awe and power of the mystique.** Similarly, it is crucial for authority to dish out unpleasant news occasionally - e.g. Greenspan shocking the stock market down 150 points in an hour - to make a resounding confirmation to people. Along this vein, it was important to remove the computer trading limits to restrict movement of the averages, so that authority can have the extreme affect that is necessary. Down is better.

As interest rates creep back up, pressures increase for major banks to merge. Their power increases exponentially as a result, and the only possible way to avoid this calamity is energy conservation. So many evils have been done in the name of energy conservation,

however, that too many industries are threatened by it and so nobody will have the courage to speak out - knowing full well he will be obliterated, his family impoverished, and even his community moribund; as a result. 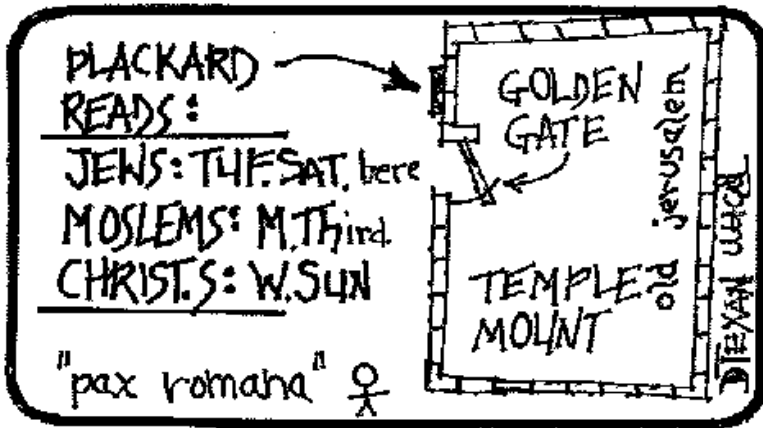

The common man trusts a computer program far more than any professional, and has

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endowed computers with an aura of authority that at one time was reserved for esteemed professionals. People have lost faith in science, and this faith has been transferred to machines. Sadly, my criticizing science and scientists only further the demise of thoughtful, intelligent people everywhere.

Terrorism

Iraq has suffered enough. The U.S. should leave ASAP, and the **United Nations** should form a task force to supervise the lifting of sanctions and a return of Iraq to the world community of nations. They made a mistake; they paid the price; now they have the right to be rehabilitated. They also deserve compensation for any oil that Kuwait has pumped out of the Iraqi side of the oil fields on their common border since the end of the Gulf War. That issue is what started the original Gulf War - Kuwait was siphoning oil out of Iraq's oil fields along their borders - and it has not yet been resolved; it probably never will be, with Iraq now being controlled by the U.S. and the multinational oil companies. That's a good thing. It dissolves the borders between all sovereign nations, in favor of imperialism and the almighty dollar. **We are the Borg. Resistance is futile. You will be assimilated.**

Ex patriots working in Saudi Arabia inform me that the kings and their immediate family take 90% of all the oil revenues for themselves. That is wrong. The **mineral wealth** of Saudi Arabia and the other Islamic kingdoms in the region should go to the people. That would go a long way to eliminating the conditions of extreme economic depravity that is the root cause of terrorism. The U.S. should assert maximum leverage to ensure a fair and equitable distribution of these oil revenues. Of course, then we might have to use fuel more equitably in America, and conserve energy ~ which is a bad thing. Conspicuous consumption of energy is the new standard of success in America - bigger cars, faster highways, less efficient buildings; burn burn burn.

There remain many harrowing questions about the September 11 attacks. Most importantly, how the homing beacons and black boxes

in most of the jets were disabled. The terrorists themselves had no such skills, or access. The President of an **international pilot's union** has told me that these devices cannot be disabled once the aircraft is in flight. This indicates that there was another group that facilitated the attacks; these people should be found. They are more dangerous than the Islamic fundamentalists; by far. Who knows, maybe a fundamentalist Israeli organization facilitated the terror attacks. It has a bizarre logic: look what's happened, Saddam Hussein is gone, America is in an all out war on terrorism. God works in strange ways.

The other technical issue about 9/11 is that the Twin Towers collapsed in a perfect implosion. You may have seen the TV special a while back when a magician escaped a collapsing casino in Las Vegas. **It took a team of experts a year to analyze the ten story building and place the explosives just right for the building to collapse without leaning any way.** You can imagine how much harder it would be to do that with a 110 story building, especially since the substructure had been damaged a few years previous by a terrorist bombing in the basement. It's no exaggeration to say that there are only a half dozen universities in the world with those kind of capabilities, and computer power; to model an aircraft impact. (My situation at UT Austin narrows them down to just one.) Moreover, it's impossible for a pilot with only a few hours experience on multi engine aircraft to have targeted such an exact point on the towers. **Remember the X Files episode (long before 9/11) when a jet was on autopilot, heading straight for the Twin Towers?** I wonder if that was part of the FBI investigation ~ actually I know it was, because I wrote them all the stuff on this page at the time. I've also posed it in all the relevant news groups.

The Administration is saying their war on terrorism will last many years; perhaps decades. At the rate they are going it's more likely it will last hundreds, or thousands, of years. It'll go down in history as the **"Thousand Years War."** It seems the Administration is carefully crafting it into a modern Crusade - protecting the Holy Land against the heathen. In so doing, they are exerting total control over not only the war effort but religion as well. Whatever happened to the strong Constitutional prerogative of separation of Church and State? As far as that goes, how long can the war go on without Congress having to declare a formal Act of War? Isn't it time Congress showed the President some support and voted us into a formal War against Terrorism? While they're at it, they could attach a constitutional amendment declaring War on Drugs and War on Poverty.

Our policy with regards to **Russia** should be re-evaluated. They have become a nation of poor people, just to have commercial links with the West. That is wrong. The standard should be that a nation provide a steadily increasing standard of living for its people, that its citizens are healthy and content and well educated. How they manage to accomplish this is flexible, so long as the level of freedom and the level of personal responsibility of the citizens is always increasing. Ditto for **Cuba**. Far from being embargoed, Cuba should be made a model for the dictatorial norm of South American nations because Cubans have more rights than anybody else in South America. Cuba doesn't export drugs either, just rum and cigars - and hope.

All they really need for the **Department of Homeland Security** to do is to buy a first class search engine from Google (they have all sizes available), and link it to the data bases of the important federal agencies. Let each of the agencies keep their own files, and do their own investigations as they always have. The key to stopping the terrorists is sifting independent sources of information from separate agencies. It's making the problem worse by eliminating the independence of all the information sources; i.e. disassembling the existing agencies and stitching them together into the Department of Homeland Security. Frankenstein lives.

With a good **Google Search Engine** linked between the sundry intelligence services, last September they could have done a search on "terrorist aircraft pilot schools al Queda bin Laden" and would have immediately gotten a prioritized list of all the important documents revealed in the media in the subsequent investigations, clearly pointing out the imminent danger of an aircraft borne terrorist attack. Hell, there was an X-files episode that was the exact same scenario. But that's science fiction; nobody believes that stuff.

The media are now saying President Bush doesn't have enough power to conduct the war on terrorism as it should be done. How much more power does he need? Consider the following list of **Executive Orders** that Bush signed into law on September 14, 2001 (most had been used by former presidents, from JFK onward, for a short while). Each Executive Order (number) "allows the government to:"

(10990) .. take over all modes of transportation and control of highways and seaports

(10995) .. seize and control the communication media

(10997) .. take over all electrical, power, gas, petroleum, fuels, and

minerals

(10998) .. take over all food resources and farms

(11000) .. mobilize civilians into work brigades under government supervision

(11001) .. take over all health, education, and welfare functions

(11002) .. designates the Postmaster General to operate a national registration of all persons

(11003) .. take over all airports and aircraft, including commercial aircraft

(11004) .. allows the Housing and Finance Authority to relocate communities, build new housing with public funds, designate areas to be abandoned, and establish new locations for populations.

(11005) .. allows the government to take over railroads, inland waterways, and public storage facilities

(11310) .. grants control to operate penal and correctional institutions

(11921) .. gives the Federal Emergency Preparedness Agency control over the mechanism of production and distribution, of energy sources, wages, salaries, credit, and the flow of money in U.S. financial instructions.

Nothing at all happened after Pearl Harbor, until a full Congress voted formally to declare War on the Axis. The President had far less power, even at the height of World War II. Presidents back then had to get what they wanted by persuasion and leadership, not with the stroke of a ball point pen in a secret room buried deeper under the surface than Hitler's den.

Accepting the fact that none of these Executive Orders have been revoked (it just takes signing another Executive Order), I now ask you what the government hopes to accomplish with the new Department of Homeland Security? The President already has **dictatorial power**. Now he seeks - with the aid of Congress - to create what can only be called a Gestapo, with the authority to spy upon every American. I'd trust the President with that kind of power - except that its quite well documented, that Bush is a Nazi. The Bush family got their fortune from investing in Nazi Germany during the 1930's. They sent all their money to Germany when America was in the middle of the Great Depression. Now they're tantamount to royalty?

Kind of makes the Kennedys, who made their fortune on bootlegging whisky during the same time, look kind of cuddly, doesn't it? Of course, along with John Kerry, they are all members of that infamous secret society at Yale called the **Skull and Bones**,

those being the most favorite symbols of the Nazi SS.

They haven't brought a single terrorist to trial; they haven't proven anything against any of them; they haven't even proven that any acts of terror have been done on U.S. soil since September 11, 2001. In fact, they have not even proven that said events were conducted by Islamic extremists. (The FBI, among other things, is currently investigating former U.S. military germ warfare experts - our own people - in the Anthrax terror.) Nor will we ever know because the **Department of Justice** has classified the entire 911 investigation. As far as that goes, the government hasn't even established beyond the benefit of a doubt that all the above Executive Orders were even required. That alone is grounds for Impeachment - but, guess what, the U.S. Congress will never do it because they are part of it. And you wonder why FEMA was created; or why the don Quixote Libertarians are so against it? There are times when FEMA is the last bastion of freedom; kind of like Social Security. Gist for mill.

This whole fiasco about Washington acting on superficial information about WMD's in the U.S. invasion of Iraq is easily explained by the fact that **all the higher ups in Washington are lawyers**, who are trained to ignore their conscience. So there were no inhibitions whatsoever about acting as they did, so adept are lawyers at stifling the most basic inklings of doubt from within their soul. Everybody was easily swayed by Authority. The same thing is happening again, as the White House pressures everybody to publish rosy predictions on job growth - 3.2 million new jobs in 2004 was the latest prediction. The next day the number of people filing for unemployment went up. **Can we believe anything Washington says now?**

Is it any surprise that Iraq is turning into the kind of horror for America that Israel is for the Jews? **Any war in which one untrained, uneducated man can destroy a million dollars worth of equipment can not ever be won.** The terrorists are smart enough to know that America cannot ever, ever abandon Iraq because they have 45% of the world's known reserves of oil. The politicians are starting to compare Iraq to Viet Nam, but there is no comparison at all other than the fact that it is a war we will not ever win on our own. All the Iraqi's want is for the U.N. to take over ~ why is the U.S. so stubbornly opposed to that idea? Resistance is futile.

A high school student made some drawings of President Bush's

head skewed on a spear, to protest the war in Iraq. His teacher told the school principle, who told the FBI, who told the Secret Service, who turned it over to Homeland Security - who investigated. Lastly, the story made the CNN headline news on their website, and made a prominent example to every free thinking person in America. Of course, terrorists use this paranoia every day to pummel the stock exchanges all around the globe ~ **what better motivation possible, for a dirt poor moron to know that when he dies in an act of terrorism, the net worth of the world will drop by tens of billions of dollars.** If anything, the media treats terrorists kinder and gentler because they are in a formal war; the high school student has far less esteem in their eyes, what little he does have is by virtue of the newsworthiness of his story. People do not realize that the strength of democracy is the freedom to express ideas, whatever their content it's part of the process of finding solutions. If anything, **the more difficult the problem the greater should be the freedom of expression.** The trend is dramatically in the opposite direction; thus, the problem of terrorism will not be solved ~ because the status quo does not want to solve them, as they serve their purposes nicely.

The Arabs and OPEC think of energy conservation as westerners think of terrorists. Every terrorist act rattles the stock markets; **every new incentive by activists or environmentalists or engineers to promote energy conservation is to the Arabs an act of terrorism.** They react so violently because energy conservation is so exceedingly simple - painting roofs white all over America will lower our energy use by 25% overnight. Installing attic fans in every attic will lower the energy use by another 25%. Timing stoplights in major cities will reduce gas consumption by 25%. Marketing energy efficient vehicles will lower the gas consumption another 25%. All of these things could be done very easily, in weeks. That is what they fear the most.

This plan has been in progress for decades. The Freon Ban was heavily promoted by the Arabs because it requires equipment that is 25% less efficient ~ making up the losses from the Arab Oil Embargo of the 1970's. They control the HVAC organizations, and police the engineering community to ensure that air quality standards will remain unenforceable so that they are able to lobotomize America, and nobody will be smart enough to figure out what has happened to them. **For every aggressive action U.S. forces take in Iraq, there is an equal action in America to undermine all of the instructions that protect and preserve our freedoms.**

The true power of terrorism is that it keeps the stock markets on a razor's edge. **That lets the super rich Arab sheiks control the direction of the markets, starting an avalanche of selling whenever they want.** They have done so repeatedly, every time I organize an effort to promote energy conservation in a meaningful way, and increasingly in ways that appeal to the American public. The only thing that has kept them from success so far is the cover of my book, which is an Islamic symbol - so they think. That edge is all but over now, as they have taken hostage many contractors and it makes my promoting energy conservation out to be a motivation for these acts. Energy conservation has itself become a punishable offense as aiding and abetting the enemy, and is enforceable as such under the new rules of engagement, post hostage taking.

Terrorism is fundamentally the reaction of a technologically primitive culture to an advanced, aggressive one. Terrorists are scared of change, and hide behind the equally primitive skirts of their religion. Historically, terrorists have been civilized by the advanced culture - Rome being the finest example - but in the modern day, the terrorists have control of the world's energy resources. They have the power (and the skills) to change the advanced culture, forcing it to become more primitive, less advanced, and de-evolved. The terrorists, having to use the accouterments of their enemy to accomplish their ends inevitably become a little more civilized - but society at large, driven to live in a peaceful, predictable world - will sacrifice as many of its "civil rights" as necessary. The extreme volatility of the stock markets accentuates this trend, and the ability of the super rich Arab sheiks to play this card, accentuates the trend even more. The third strike is the existence of the black fundamentalist Islamic movement in America - with prominent people like Condoleeza Rice and Janet Jackson willing and able to implement their radical agenda on a national level.

Fundamentally, corporate influence is spread by virtue of advertising based exclusively on appealing to people's sexuality. The Arabs are extremely sensitive to this, and have reacted with terrorism - which is basically supported by all Arabs, directly or indirectly. They don't like the idea that imperialism subverts their sexuality, transferring all those instincts to materialistic ones. **The end result of the scheme is that people have fewer kids so they can have more material possessions,** but advertising does it so unassertively (why just make better products that sell themselves because of quality ~ all the billions spent on advertising could be devoted to creating a

higher quality product, which would probably last too long and void the planned obsolescence coda) that they are short circuiting the sex drive itself. A few generations down the line there will be no sexual attraction between opposite sexes at all. Which is kind of sexy in itself, because people worship technology so much they would rather have a test tube baby in the first place.

The road to hell is paved with good intentions. Everybody is doing just what they believe is right. In their sphere of influence they are probably right, too. **The problem is that actions by anybody held in high esteem by the public has a far ranging affect upon events and opinions and people far beyond the point of origin.** The internet has done this, in promoting instantaneous communication of the slightest rumor ~ which has an extreme affect because everybody is already on edge because of terrorism. Ultimately, the net result of terrorism will be the demise of Islam, to the point where any effort to revive it will itself be considered an act of terror because the philosophy has caused so much extreme harm in so many ways. Fundamentalism of any kind - Islamic, Christian, or Jewish - will likely be expunged from the modern philosophical lexicon, for the same reason. By definition, the three religions themselves will be lost because they hold no interest to people without their mystical components.

It has been shown how extreme levels of security have driven scientists en masse to a quasi schizoid condition. **A whole series of other modern trends is driving everybody else over the same cliff.** Terrorism has maintained an ultra high stress level world wide; add to that global job competition, massive outsourcing of jobs, escalating oil prices, military hardship on friends and relatives, political malfeasance, despotic corporate leadership, increasing environmental degradation, religious palsy, and a religious crusade against sexual freedoms in the media. All these things drive people to the brink of schizophrenia, and the grasp at all the social supports our society has - political parties, religious groups, business and trade association membership; all of which, you guessed it, institutionalize their mental state and make people forever dependent upon the system. Its the classic model of how the Nazis gained absolute power in Germany in the 1930's through constant propaganda, constant violence in the streets, and escalating threats from their enemies.

Where the Nazi's failed, this modern blitzkrieg will not. Power and wealth are much more concentrated, modern advertising much more intrusive, and politicians far more adept at twisting peoples

minds to obscure what is going on before their very eyes. The Nazi's have been building their infrastructure for sixty years, layer upon layer, nation to nation, and across continents. They have the money, the influence, and the ruthless will to carry out their fiendish plan.

The linchpin to the whole scheme, as I have suspected all along, is that **the Nazis are in control of Israel**. They have played on the Arab hatred of Jews to keep the world in a state of permanent chaos, and finally sparking the U.S. war in Afghanistan and Iraq to draw America into the morass - and to thereby undermine the nation that has always been the greatest impediment to the Fourth Reich. Even with their own President in place - and both Presidential contenders owing allegiance to the swastika - the Nazis are still quite far from subverting the United States.

At UT Austin the expert on Unified Field Theory, Wheeling, is often quoted in the newspapers as saying that the UFT is tens of thousands of years in the future. During which time society will have to focus all its attention on achieving that single goal ~ i.e. giving scientists absolute authority over everything. **In order to control this evolution of mankind, they needed a catalyst to give them that kind of authority in the perception of the general population.** Facilitating the Twin Tower attacks by disabling the homing beacons and black boxes did just that. They would not have been able to do this, and escape discovery by the massive investigation, unless it was all done without paperwork or any traceable activity. They need this authority - far, far beyond that rationally due to any group - in order to have plausible deniability of Leviathan, and of their symbiotic relationship with it as the Borg. They will overhaul the entire educational system, from kindergarten to graduate school, to give all intelligent humans an almost genetic respect for authority as they wield it into the foreseeable future.

A part of the respect of authority regimen is for high level individuals to come under egregious scrutiny for alleged wrongs, but the survive unscathed. Bush's invasion of Iraq is a case to point; Clinton's scandalous affair with Monica Lewinski and this other lesser, almost weekly, foul ups; all the way back to Kennedy and Chappaquidick. The same thing happens on the more local scale, but the national scandals are most effective because they show the invincibility of authority under the worse possible circumstances. The inevitable conclusion people make is that authority is always right, criticizing or investigating them is always a waste of time; relax, trust, and get on with your life.

The Economy

There are ten million illegal immigrants in America, and five million unemployed Americans. Meanwhile, Washington is trying to make these illegal immigrants legal; and all the special interests groups that pay for the advertising that puts politicians in office are sending jobs overseas by the boatload. The only part of the job market that is growing is the service sector. **All the good professional jobs are going away.** Business likes it. Washington likes it. The rich get richer. The poor get poorer. It's the new American Dream.

Meanwhile, those ten million illegal immigrants are having tens of millions of children, all of whom are American citizens because they are born on U.S. soil. It's no wonder we have such an unemployment problem now, this illegal immigrant situation has been ignored for so many years - because the powerful construction industry needs the cheap labor - that it's festered into an ugly situation that threatens class warfare. That's what happens when special interests have so much power; and when the people have so little. It's Israel-vs.-the Palestinians all over again, in a hundred different niches, all along the U.S.-Mexico border. And the Department of Defense is planning to shut down 25% of the U.S. bases; most of them in Texas and California ~ who's play book are

they going by?

This whole terrorism deal is giving religious fundamentalism a bad name. Big business likes that. **People with shallow convictions and tepid religion are more easily swayed by advertising.** That means higher profits with less effort. Religion is counter productive too. It gives people the inner strength to stand up for their rights, to demand equality, and the power to make the filthy rich feel guilty for all the poor sods they've gotten rich off of by ripping them off. That's why the super rich have their own churches, schools, universities, clubs, and even shopping centers. Segregation is back. Contact with commoners like you and I make them feel guilty, so they avoid it at all costs. The ironic part is that we poor people are the ones who pay for their isolationism, because they have all the power. Not even in America, where politicians are elected by the people, do the people have any power because the politicians have all the money from the rich people to pay for the television ads that tell people who to vote for. I hope the Iraqis keep this in mind when they create their new constitution.

Google added a billion new web pages to its search engine last month. With each passing day it gets harder and harder for people to advertise on the web; and more and more costly to reach fewer and fewer customers. Ten years from now there will be so many web pages that people will be paying \$1.00 per click. **Everybody loves the web though**; we don't mind that 30% of the cost of the things we purchase any more goes to pay for the web. What the hell, Bill Gates Himself owns 30% of Microsoft and we don't mind giving him \$30 for every \$100 copy of MS Office we purchase - He needs the money. And besides, they have really elaborate, high tech, exciting, innovative ads on TV. Why not ~ there's no competition. It's baffling why they have ads at all, unless to give us the illusion there is competition ~ so they can charge even more for their products.

Just how DO you prevent situations like happened with **Chrysler**? The government bailed them out of bankruptcy, then built them back to profitability by giving them major contracts to build Army personnel carriers, tanks, and other armaments. Then **Daimler-Benz** purchased Chrysler and not only got access to all our military technology but also took everything that the American government and the American people had invested in the firm and its future. Now that Germany is no longer an independent nation, but a state in the European Union, this policy should be re-evaluated. Of course, every corporation in the world is doing that to America now,

with outsourcing and every manageable variation thereof. It's too bad corporate citizens can't be charged with treason because they sure as hell would be guilty - of terrorism too, most likely.

The American people have paid for all the research and development on our advanced military technology, so it is only right that their companies should be able to benefit too. **"Made in the U.S.A."** should become once again a respected trademark worldwide as a symbol of quantity, dependability, and simplicity. If American companies can manage to create superlative machines and materials, surely their market share will increase and profitability will follow on short order. Only mediocre technologies need to depend upon marketing and manipulation of the public to sell their products. Hitler said that, much to the consternation of all the Marxist capitalists the world around.

Much of our military technology has been lost to foreign espionage already - the Chinese have our best nuclear and rocket technologies; the rest of the world all our best space technology via the International Space Station project. **We are only wasting money keeping it all ultra secret.** Furthermore, the only purpose in keeping these technologies secret any longer is to ensure that the Red Chinese economy will benefit from them; and nobody else. The Chinese satellite launching operations have already practically put the American aerospace industry out of competition (we must pay for decades of research overhead; they have only to pay for espionage in stealing our technology.) Better to get what remaining value we can out of it by letting American industry use it. The military is good at creating new things; but American industry has the ingenuity and creativity to go much farther still. Too bad neither knows it, because everything is classified out of reach. With much of the existing stockpile of classified technology dispersed to industry, the military will then be free to advance our capabilities to the next level. This will **spur research and development** in American companies too. Our security apparatus is shot with holes already; this will give us the opportunity to start from scratch and build an impenetrable security network to keep this new generation of technology American; always. Student loans should be doubled, with options to pay them back via federal or military service or research for the Defense Department at the graduate level. Likewise, universities will be encouraged to open up as many staff positions as possible to provide students work that is convenient to their studies. Especially foreign students because

they pay so much higher tuition. Then these foreign students can go home with their powerful education, and build all the technology that American can't.

Those who make over a certain amount should be able to designate exactly how they want it to be spent by the government.

Corporations can go further, in designating specific research to be funded a-la **Sematech**. It's hard enough to give lots of money away. The least the government can do is give some tangible return on their investment. Accountability will be enforced. Any breakthrough will become an IPO and make the rich richer. Any failure will be a tax deduction and none of the venture capitalists will lose their mansions.

Day trading in the stock exchanges - by either Americans or foreign nationals - should be considered a felony. Investing is a long term enterprise. Day trading is robbery by definition. People who lose money in day trading should not be allowed to deduct the losses from their federal taxes; ditto for gambling losses. They're both mental illnesses. There should also be an investigation into the role of **computerized trading** in the extreme volatility of the stock indexes, which happens intraday, day-to-day, and otherwise. The number of shares traded on any given day lately exceeds the number of shares traded in a week, ten years ago back before computer trading.

Every week there's an outbreak of **Mad Cow Disease** or **Bird Flu** that sends stocks reeling. The scientists scratch their heads wondering what could be wrong. Any idiot knows the problem: animals have minds too and if they don't use them, they go crazy. Apparently scientists will all be going nuts any time soon too, having shown little evidence of using their bird brains but always deferring to their bovine balls; I call it the "military industrial complex" that has endowed them with so much respect for their own inestimable expertise that they can't possibly imagine they are wrong about anything. We all know what happened to Jesus, who claimed to have done nothing wrong at all . . .

Can we **pay off the national debt**? It is reprehensible that Congress voted to give a \$1.6 trillion tax cut, and \$1.5 trillion of it went to the richest 1% of Americans. When you are a homeowner and you have some extra cash you don't spend it all on a trip to Fiji; you pay down the mortgage or sock away some money for the kids education. Instead they are taking money out of the poor people's retirement fund, Social Security. Over 80% of the wear and tear on

highways is done by the large heavy trucks; yet it's the little car drivers who pay for it all. Ditto for how the American system facilitates the rich getting richer; compliments of the penny ante taxes of millions of hard working middle class Americans.

Recently the **NASDAQ** went from over 5000 to under 2000. Before this happened virtually every major stock brokerage firm, every business magazine, and every business evangelist on TV told investors to put at least 40% of their stocks in firms listed on the NASDAQ. Here in Austin - a hub of the high tech boom - most folks put more than that, trying to support the local businesses. We lost everything. Everybody but Michael Dell and the other senior executives at Dell and the other major firms. I wonder how many of them followed the advice of all the "experts"? **They've made Martha Stewart's case into an Inquisition** just to warn the tens of thousands of other super rich folks who profited criminally from the tech boom and bust; to dive for cover - and stay there.

The benefits of federal grandiosity should NOT go to those **multinational firms** that have closed down U.S. facilities and moved any of their operations overseas during the latest recession. They have shown themselves to be unAmerican, and their charter to operate in the U.S. should be revoked. This would probably happen to all the large cap, Fortune 500 companies. Let them fend for themselves in the world market against the **European activist community**. Americans have always done best with small and mid-sized companies anyway.

The same goes for companies whose directors like **Sam Walton** at Wall Mart, **Bill Gates** at Microsoft, and **Michael Dell** at Dell Computers own such a huge share of the stock that whenever anybody purchases one of their products at least 25% of the price goes straight to the CEO or the Board of Directors. People who can do that with a clear conscience are no longer human beings. Fifty years ago they called that racketeering, profiteering, and put those thugs in jail for the rest of their days. Gates, Dell, et al deserve no less.

Otherwise, the Bush Administration will never create the 3.2 million jobs they want in 2004 if they continue blind support of big business. The large cap companies will just keep sending new jobs overseas where labor is cheaper; or continue to lobby for permanent resident status for the cheap immigrant workers. No, **if Bush et al want to create jobs they have to support the small and mid cap companies**. They better get going because right now the rate of

new jobs being created doesn't even keep up with the growth of the work force itself.

The economy is like a multi engine aircraft run by a great big rubber band, like the balsa wood model airplanes they used to make for kids. When the economy is booming interest rates gradually increase, giving the Federal Reserve the ability to let go the coiled up rubber band when the economy slows to get it growing again. The government uses taxes for the same purpose - lowering taxes to give people more money that they can spend to prop up a sagging economy. The only problem is that lower taxes means a higher deficit, a less efficient government, and long term a government trapped into higher debt payments. To think that it takes a veritable army of Ph.D. economists to run this exceedingly simple economic system... The only thing that makes it possible for them to do so effectively is because everybody behaves just exactly the same (rollover the image), so by definition we are Borg.

Consumer sentiment is what has kept the U.S. economy afloat for years now - people being hopeful in the face of war, political negligence, wall street thefts, and sundry other transgressions by virtually every institution in the land. Now we are losing faith. Technology has been our champion - but there is absolutely nothing really new in sight. **The space effort is worse than a B-rated movie. New gizmos are more flim than flam.** Why? Because everything in the whole technological lexicon is either classified by one government or another, or kept a corporate secret by thousands of Fortune 500 multinationals who use this power to maintain their market share. Microsoft's monopoly is the rule, not the exception.

The standard response by Washington to excessive economic growth is raising interest rates. Why not do something more productive to slow the economy than pump money into financial institutions, which are already making record profits? **A much more productive way to slow the economy would be to phase in energy conservation standards.** That makes businesses more efficient, and locks in energy savings long term. Every large business could be required to pass a regular energy audit. With each new business cycle the conservation standards can be increased, so that eventually America would be as energy efficient as our global competition - Japan, Europe, and Asia.

The wonderful thing about energy conservation projects is that they pay themselves off in a few years. **So right about the time the business cycle is turning over, and the economy needs a shot of adrenaline to grow, businesses are experiencing a 30% to 60% reduction in utility bills.** That is, the utility bills remain constant while the energy conservation projects are being paid off. After that there is an immediate reduction in utility bills. What better way to generate growth in any business than to prop up the bottom line?

Energy inflation is going to be a problem soon. So far it's counter acted the deflation fears economists have had, because computer applications have increased productivity at such a rapid rate in recent years. Nobody figured that China and Latin America would traverse the event horizon, and start industrializing at a break neck pace. They are getting more and more work from the western nations via outsourcing of every possible kind of job, every kind of industry. **Their output per energy unit far exceeds that offered by Americans, OPEC realizes this, and so individual members of OPEC are sending excess output to these areas** - to secure a permanent market for their product, in a region which will be able to pay higher and higher prices for oil because their workers are paid such low wages.

America has the infrastructure to compete on equal terms with these markets, because the ability of energy conservation to benefit from complex networking. Sharing power, keeping generating facilities optimally loaded, generating and transmitting power at the most efficient levels - in regions, states, and within buildings - are all highly developed disciplines, proven by countless engineering applications, and applied in as many different scenarios as their exist. **Implementing these strategies on a national level will instantly rocket America into competition with any low wage region of the world.** We have the capability of using energy more efficiently than any other economy. The problem is that we lack the political will (because of special interests), the public knowledge and comfort level (because of special interests), and the entrepreneurial freedom to implement such a program (because of special interests).

Businesses have a comfort threshold for technology, just as individuals do. Endless viruses and security upgrades that are for ever being over ridden by hackers who are never caught or prosecuted, have taken their toll on corporate board rooms staffed by MBA's and not engineers. Extant business models cannot cope

with the rapid change of technology, the security and other issues. They outsource these tasks to knowledgeable firms, but these high tech firms are working under such an extreme level of profit expectation by their share holders that they charge outrageous fees for work that is outdated almost as soon as it is complete. Viruses and spam are the land mines of modern business, and those who facilitate or actualize them are no less guilty of heinous crimes against humanity as terrorists who plant land mines on battle fields around the world.

Unless the operating technology of networking necessary for modern business operations can be simplified or made more secure and dependable, then energy conservation will never happen because it depends upon the computer infrastructure as well. **A virus in the energy monitoring and control network could deplete energy reserves and that's one more risk that already tentative business leaders are unable to cope with.** Higher energy prices are at least a known, if an uncomfortable one; to them energy conservation holds just as great a risk of causing those prices to increase because of hacking, or malfeasance, or outright incompetence; as they do to cause utility bills to decrease. The downside risk outweighs the upside potential.

President Bush gave a guts-and-glory redneck press conference a couple of days ago. The American people rallied around his arrogant and offensive stand vis-a-vis Iraq. **He forgot that many people around the world were watching too, and were greatly offended.** They are voting their feelings now, by withdrawing their money from the U.S. stock market. America may be a total dictatorship, but the whole world is still a democracy and people have learned to vote their feelings with their investments. The world has been extremely tolerant of Americans because of all the awesome new technology we have created - the internet, satellite technology, space exploration incentives, and countless other innovations in every realm of endeavor. They have given us cheap oil, freedom to swagger around the world with our military, and turned the other cheek at all the Washington foibles. Their tolerance is wearing thin, however.

It is easy to see that industries everywhere abuse the natural wealth of the Earth to make a quick profit. A little more subtle - **but far more profitable** - is how pharmaceutical companies abuse the natural health of the human body to make a quick profit, by breeding dependence on drugs. This natural health includes physical and mental, as well as spiritual resistance to disease. The CDC reports

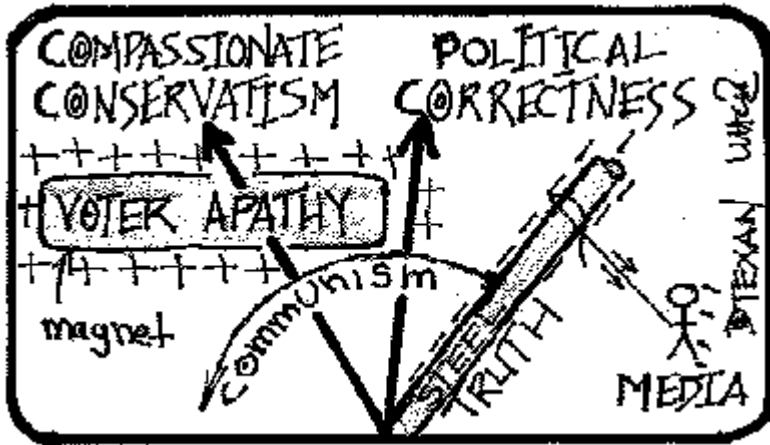
that fewer physicians counsel their obese patients to lose weight ~ of course they don't because the patients will then just go to another physician. Besides, obese patients have many more medical problems than fit ones and they keep coming back for treatment, and sometimes even require very expensive procedures.

I believe there are many checks and balances created with independent means, to protect the secret of the Borg hive mind vis-a-vis Leviathan. Because short term the effect is not seen in stock prices, but long term the effect will be grievous ~ except by that time there will be no more

competition, and the point will be moot.

The Military

Have you ever thought that by far the easiest way to launder money is via political contributions? Did you know that **all senior officers in the military - one star generals and above - must get Congressional approval as they earn each of their stars.** That means they are as much politicians as any elected official - if not more so. Is it any wonder, seeing how things are going in Iraq? Our military personnel are politicians, not military officers.

Only a dozen Universities in the country have athletic programs that make a profit. The several hundred others, in order to compete, must use a great deal of funds from their general endowment funds just to keep their sports programs competitive. **These same Universities get 80% of their scientific and engineering research funding from the federal government.** If the athletic programs were downsized to realistic proportions like they were thirty years ago, they wouldn't need so much money from the government. The government is, in actual fact, funding all the college sports programs in the nation. Not only are the professional style football teams of the University of Texas et al bankrupting virtually every other university in the nation, but they're robbing from the military, and undermining the national defense.

We need to know exactly how much this homeland defense is costing the taxpayers. Having a hundred thousand military

reservists working full time is OK, but only if they are absolutely necessary. Just because the civilian agencies responsible for security at the airports aren't doing their jobs doesn't mean the federal government should do it for them. It's **unconstitutional** for the government to use federal active duty or reserve military personnel on domestic missions. Unless an extremely serious threat can be proven to still exist, the military has no business participating in what they claim is defense of our homeland.

As the world economy drifts ever deeper into recession, other **political divisions** will inevitably arise. Communism and totalitarianism thrive on poverty. Russia's dalliance with a free market economy was less than a disaster only because the economic environment in the rest of the world was so strong. Recession has weakened the legs of the Russian economy, to the point of collapse. Similar conditions exist on virtually every continent. Weak political institutions make way to extremism, and the resolution of the world community of nations to eradicate the terrorism menace suffers the consequences. Get ready for Communism everybody.

The United States military must not fail in their purpose, to defend **the American way of life**. The American people must not fail in their support of the military, and their objectives overseas - however vague or ill defined. We must have faith in the military, and this faith must be bolstered by actions across the entire population. Say a little prayer for bin Laden too, that his huge investments in the military industrial complex will give him a good retirement in Palm Springs. What? Didn't you know that he was trained by the CIA? Bin Laden is a hero in many circles because his activities in Afghanistan brought the Iron Curtain down. Traditionally, Americans have looked to technology to win our wars. That's important, but we should devote more attention to the human factors. The "three strikes and your out" rule is **unconstitutional**. Those so considered should be inducted into the military and be used in drug interdiction. Their pay and benefits will go to the victims. A military tribunal can decide, after a minimum of ten years of hard service, if they can return to civilian status. If they want to. Students who remain at one of the **service academies** more than

one year should not have to pay back any of their education. These are valuable individuals with solid training, and they will be required to work with local national guard or reserve units with the expectation (not requirement) they become full time service members once their education is completed. If they really are allergic to the military, they will be given extra points for federal job placement, especially with the postal service. If you're really good you can work for the U.S. Forest Service and help cut down, burn or otherwise eradicate virgin growth forests all over America. Chastity is a sin in heathen, godless, down with the Ten Commandments America.

The military has a big problem retaining officers beyond their initial commitment. We need to find ways to convince them to make the military a career. Allow **career officers** to take a year off, say every sixth year, to spend in a civilian position at a federal agency in the U.S. Allow those with over fifteen years of service to take a two year sabbatical at half pay to do whatever they like, in exchange for re-upping for ten more years. Career officers with small children can be relocated less frequently, to keep the kids in the same school system. Add this up: the Pentagon has just cancelled the Comanche helicopter program; and recently cancelled the Crusader artillery program; and announced plans last week to close 20% of all bases in the U.S. Meanwhile, the Department of Defense budget is at an all time high. **Where's all that money going?** Iraq of course ~ did anybody plan on gutting the entire U.S. military capability just to get rid of one man, and to sniff around for Weapons of Mass Destruction that have been gone since 1990? Of course not; everybody thought it would turn out just like Israel.

Conducting a war half a world away is motivating a transition from men to machines. It costs so much to fly each service member over there and back, not to mention medical costs, GI insurance, and other incidentals. Even the men who do participate are gusset'd up with mechanical and electronic tools that they are half way to looking like the Borg already. As fiscal pressures mount, this trend escalates. It starts with men operating machines remotely like video games, then becomes (as in the rollover image) men incorporating machines into their bodies to become more effective.

The U.S. forces in Iraq have begun to deploy a small army of robots to detect and defuse land mines. The manufacturers of these robots had a huge party celebrating the first robot that was destroyed by a land mine. The company said it was because they saved the life of a service member. The more likely explanation is that the Army will be purchasing a replacement robot, at \$55,000 each. Industry makes the mines and the robots to blow up the mines, and nobody bothers to consider that **the companies that built the land mines in the first place are as guilty of crimes against humanity as the most despotic ruler, of any nation, of any era.** It's astonishing to think that none of the millions who have been drastically disabled by a mine have ever sued the perpetrators.

The war on terrorism has been a much welcomed boon for the media. There's nothing quite like a good war to sell newspapers, increase listeners, and push up advertising revenue. It's strange, however, that there have been absolutely no negative repercussions from this latest spate of terrorism. Typically, advertisers shy from plying their wares during particularly violent episodes, e.g. the start of the Iraq war. They don't want to be associated with war in people's minds. They don't seem to be the least bit concerned about that possibility now. Evidently violence appeals to Americans now, just as they admire an obstinate, arrogant, conceited President.

Be that as it may, it is a well known inclination for the media to make things seem much more drastic or extreme than they really are. The Bush Administration complained about this kind of biased media coverage early in the war, making the situation seem worse than it really was. With the world on edge as much as it is lately, this gives the media ultimate power over everybody ~ investors run when acts of terror happen; terrorists are motivated to action when they see acts of other terrorists flashed around the world, making them an instant martyr. **Governments cower when the media gets the public angry at something they have done.** Soldiers get

depressed to see how it's all playing out state side, and have a hard time conducting their dangerous duties with the attentiveness necessary.

The military, like everybody else is outsourcing. Private security firms are making a fortune providing protection to contractors in Iraq. The contractors themselves are making easy money, under the less than vigilant auspices of the Army Corps of Engineers. Robots are being brought in to do as many jobs as possible. **The U.S. forces are, in fact, doing everything possible but asking for help from the United Nations.** A few nations have sent troops to help out, but always the U.S. demands to be in total control of the troops. That, of course, puts the non-American troops in far more danger than they need to be - if they were there as U.N. troops, or even under autonomous control, they would be quite safe. The British, for example, control 20% of the territory in Iraq and have suffered 2% as many fatalities or injuries as the American troops.

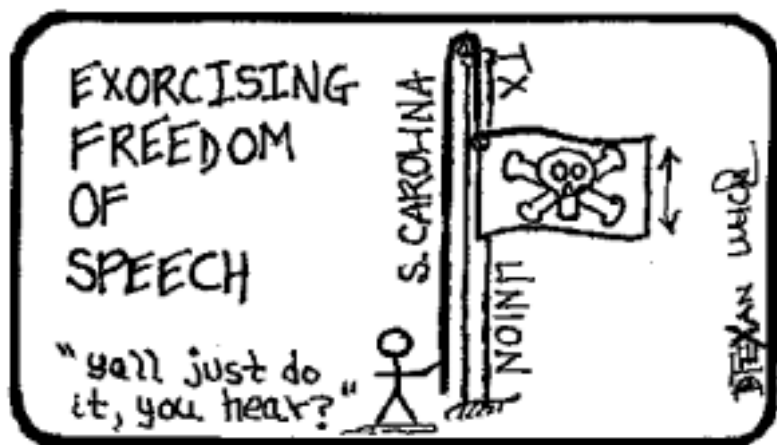
This is the military-industrial complex at its finest. **The military holds the ground while industry moves in to rebuild all complex buildings destroyed during the invasion.** It's no wonder that the terrorists have started to perceive the civilian contractors as combatants themselves, because they are in fact just that - if not more so, because they are profiting from the situation far more than anybody else, especially the U.S. Army.

The medical-industrial complex is subtly behind the scenes as well. They are responsible for all the technological enhancements the soldiers have - cameras on their helmets, microphones with a small communication network with others in their squad; hand held GPS receivers; laser guided munitions, and remote piloted drones and robots. It's likely that the medico's are who keep the U.S. as the controlling military force there in Iraq, for just that reason - to field test a whole space of new medical technology designed to enhance the capabilities of soldiers on the battlefield.

Robot jet aircraft is the latest trend in military hardware. They can maneuver more deftly without having to worry about g-forces on fragile human flesh pilots, they have a higher payload because the human and all the life support systems are not necessary, and they exclude the cost of the pilot training - and pilot pay, benefits, and mortality expenses. Moreover, the general degradation of the human physiology can be allowed to progress as necessary, or even escalate. These are the same trends that have been driving the automation of factories, replacing expensive, undependable,

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inaccurate humans with machines and computerized controls. The greater the extent that any given process can be automated, the cheaper it is in the long run ~ even taking into account cheap overseas labor.

Culture

It should be used as a last resort only; not as a drug of convenience. The Church should be concerned, how undermining such fundamental human drives will affect the soul.

The fundamentalist religious right has taken control with a vengeance, and in only a few weeks time have rolled back the sexual revolution of the 60's and are headed straight for a Victorian England style inflexibility. **In no time at all women will be out of the work force, back home, subservient, and servile...** This is headed far more extreme than any Christian dogma that ever existed, but toward the Islamic fundamentalist of veiled women considered to be the property of their husbands.

Clearly, the Arab sheiks have invested heavily in the American media. They have begun to assert their control now, to convert the western world to Islam. They do so cleverly, by supporting the Christian fundamentalists whose views on women, in particular, are not unlike their own ~ the Southern Baptists, who believe women should follow their husband's lead wherever they go; the ultra Orthodox Jews whose wives must sit behind them in Sabbath services. These Arab sheiks know the historical animosity between Christians and heathen Arabs, and seek to avoid another episode of the Crusades by asserting total, Nazi level control over our media outlets. Every terrorist action rolls back out civil liberties. Eventually no civil liberties will remain, and they will have won. **America will be just like Saudi Arabia with the super rich sheiks, with their huge families of playboy children driving Rolls Royces, and groveling masses of the poor who differ from slaves in name only.** That is already happening with the likes of Sam Walton, Bill Gates, Michael Dell, and tens of thousand more of the super rich.

Authority has never had it so easy as in the modern day. The government released retail sales figures today - the number jumped 1.8 percent versus the 0.6% predicted by economists. The stock market panicked, dropped 2% despite solid earnings from many big companies. Everybody said the Fed would have to raise interest rates to slow down the steaming economy. They're wrong because most of those products in retail sales aren't even made in America, and they know that. **The massive outsourcing of jobs has changed all the parameters, and Wall Street is still reacting to all the old parameters ~ all those Ph.D. economists are probably confused as hell right now, trying to figure out this profound flaw in their holy predictions.** The sad part about this is that nobody has the courage to doubt the economists, even to the point of panicking when their expert predictions are wrong. Those industries have already destroyed every corner grocery store, friendly hardware store, family doctor's office, and diner in every small town in America. Now they are going to do the same to every other culture in the whole world. There was a best seller published fifteen years ago called **The Closing of the American Mind**. Now America's global influence is causing a closing of the global mind.

Culture is public enemy #1. People with culture buy quality merchandise, expect competent sales people to assist them in their purchase selection. People with culture are not easily swayed by glitzy advertising, peer pressure, or keeping up with the Jones's. **Modern commercialism is anti-culture.** They promote the illusion that buying their products will give you culture; a far, far better culture than the real sophisticates espouse. This happens by the same principle that the "**parents: the anti-drug**" and similar ads make it seem like they are helping parents fight drugs; but, in fact, are an advertisement for the drug culture ~ that's how the kids see it, being rebellious youngsters already. Likewise for the anti-smoking ads. To the normal viewer they are what they say they are; to the

real targets for the ads, they are advertising their product, just like always. Even more so, in fact, because the sophisticated below-the-surface subterfuge really appeals to lots of people ~ the under educated, under employed, and otherwise discontented folks.

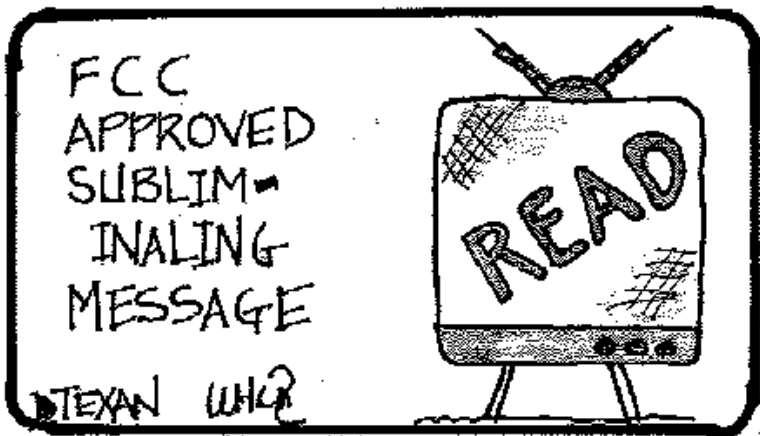
Over fifty percent of all internet users have broadband or cable speed connections. President Bush wants that everybody to have high speed access within three years. The result will be that the low tech websites will drop off the acceptability level, leaving only the large commercial sites that can afford the bandwidth, upgrade their site on a regular basis, and continually market their site. **The "rebel fringe" had their heyday with the early internet, being able to build acceptable websites quickly and cheaply to promote their agenda.** Universal broadband connections means only the large, well funded activists will be able to maintain visibility - and the cost to them will accelerate exponentially from now on, as they are overwhelmed by powerful conservative interests. Web users will increasingly expect to be entertained by lavish multi-media websites, before they even think to read anything - much less anything that is even slightly askew to the status quo. **The internet, once a powerful force for change, is increasingly an even more powerful force to quell change** because the truly motivated free thinkers will spend all their money trying to make their voice heard; and when they quickly run out of funds, their voice will be gone forever. The only such websites with any reasonable chance of surviving are ezines and they will be coerced into conformity by advertisers, as new charges for email delivery by mass emailers force an increasing dependence upon these advertisers.

It is understandable that you believe all of this to be if not made up, then extreme. However consider recent comments by Elton John on the **"American Idol"** singer contest, in which he was abhorred by the extreme racism of the voters (20 million people cast votes) by consistently relegating very obviously talented black artists to the last place. The moral is that if it's done by a democratic action, then it's not racism.

Respect for authority has been brainwashed into people, from the first day in kindergarten onward. **The war on terrorism makes this more so, since it has exposed the uneducated masses for the first time to the whole world and they are scared** - just like educated people are scared of deep space travel - and they focus obsessively on authority (politicians, CEO's of Fortune 500 companies ~ the death of McDonald's CEO today caused the markets to plummet; how bizarre). In the case of the legal justice

system, the judge has far more power even in jury trials, to affect the verdict. Jurors follow his every clue, ignoring even the most obvious evidence, wanting only to do what the authority figure wants. Terrorists being tried by military tribunals get a fairer hearing than a citizen tried by his peers in open court.

I would attribute the indiscretions done by American troops against terrorist detainees in Iraq to be caused by our shallow culture. Americans - especially young people - have no culture whatsoever, nothing that sets a moral or ethical standard. Our schools are geared toward teaching them raw knowledge, not erudition or creativity or appreciation of the arts. Until that changes there are no rules or regulations or punishments that will prevent that sort of thing as happened in Iraq from happening again. The military culture is even more shallow than the civilian culture - the Army figured putting a black beret on top of every soldier's head would make them civilized. It's not what goes on top of their heads, but what goes in their heads - and especially their hearts that matters.

Space

America spends more money on exploring space than we do exploring Earth. The deterioration of the ozone layer could very likely make Earth just like Mars in a generation. Ironically, Washington is gutting the whole NASA space program ~ guess what, to pay for manned expeditions to Mars. **Next time you see images from Mars take a very good look because that is what Earth will look like to your children;** or to you, if you are young right now. I guess they don't call it the Red Planet for nothing ~ because the only way Earth can survive, the way the scientific community has painted us into a corner, is for Communism to reign supreme.

There is great controversy within different areas of NASA over using **robots versus men** to explore space. Politics has no place in NASA. Different agencies have their specific missions and they should cooperate in the achievement thereof. Pound for pound you can't do better than a human astronaut on a complicated mission; whereas robots are ideal for certain kinds of missions as well. NASA should aggressively plan missions of both types, and all their resources should be available to both teams. So far this strife in the ranks has scored two wins for the robotics ~ the shuttle disaster and the Mars landings. Hooray for robots. More robots. R2D2.

It is becoming increasingly important for America to have a secure, **dependable source of energy**. In the last few years alone, California's largest utility has gone bankrupt, Enron has folded - bringing trillions of American worker's retirement savings with them. The escalating war on terrorism threatens to envelope major oil exporters in the region. We need a secure energy source if we are to conduct the war against terrorists without the possibility of retaliation against our energy supplies. A major incentive is needed to study collecting solar energy from space, and transforming it into power in our utility grids. What a novel idea - doing something practical in space with government funding. No. It'll never happen.

Space can be made self-supporting, even profitable, by increasing government research into "**power from space**" incentives. One reasonable project is to build a collecting station on the moon and to transmit the energy to Earth. We have already put men and machines on the moon - it's time to use that technology to put power

plants on the moon so America can have a secure and dependable energy future. Naturally all the oil companies oppose that and since Bush is an old oil man, and Cheney too - two strikes and we're out.

We need a new and **improved shuttle fleet**. The shuttle technology was a decade old when it was originally constructed twenty years ago. The shuttles are already far beyond their expected lifetime, and yet we are now making increasing demands upon them - to build and provision the International Space Station. They are fulfilling these escalating demands on lower budgets, less public support, and versus increasing problems in funding from Congress. Of course, they aren't doing anything any more - but every thing looks so good on paper, why change it?

Given the importance of energy to the national defense, and NASA's proven ability to make optimal use of limited funds, the **Space Commands** of all the military services should be put under the direction of NASA. This will give them the additional funding, manpower, and resources they need to ensure a timely and safe completion of their current objectives. We need to be sure the Hubble telescope crashes safely to Earth when its orbit degrades. We need to be sure the Chinese get all our manned moon mission technology - after all, the Chinese lobby in Washington has more money than any other, with the Chinese economy booming lately while ours stagnates. You know, my cast iron barbells are "Made in China" ~ there has got to be something bad wrong with a system that lets such a heavy, low tech item be sold in America at a profit. That something is Washington.

There was one glaring flaw in the investigation of the shuttle disaster last spring. Everybody placed the blame on the **NASA Culture** but nobody identified it. The culprit is the University of Texas at Austin, which has the virtually unknown Center for Space Research which - believe it or not - is 2nd only to JPL in the space echelon. In fact, at least 70% of the engineers at JPL are themselves UT graduates or employees, or otherwise tied to UT Austin. Nobody should be able to assert that much influence from complete anonymity. Well, other than special interests groups in Washington.

Long term, we need a new goal. We need **an American goal**, not an international one. The U.S. space program has given our technology and expertise generously to virtually every other space program in the world. This generosity has not been rewarded in kind. Consequently, we should be more circumspect in sharing with

other nations - as they have always been, and continue to be, with us. We need our own dream; and that dream should be a manned mission to Mars. We want heritage not hate in space.

This should be a joint venture with **American corporations** (and not international multinationals, either). They need the excitement of participating in a high tech venture; their employees need the opportunity to take part in something different and exciting; challenging and intellectually stimulating. We all need a big, bright, exciting new adventure to pull together and show the world what America is all about. We need to put men on Mars; and to thereafter keep them there in a permanent and expanding presence. Just think how happy those six men will be at the climax of their trillion dollar mission, to think of the billions of starving children back on Earth. Don't tell any of the Mars fanatics that.

An enduring question in the early U.S. space program is why the Nixon Administration made NASA destroy all the design plans of the huge **Apollo rockets** used before the shuttle program was begun. Apparently they didn't want to have any competition for the shuttle. Yet the fact remains that those rockets were capable of putting a large payload in orbit very efficiently - they are sorely needed now to build and provision the International Space Station. Incidentally, the scientific community has recently established that the usefulness of the ISS is over ~ and it's not even complete yet. I suppose it's only useful purpose for them was to transfer all our best technology to every nuclear weapon wannabe in the whole world.

Another compelling question is how the Russians were able to build a carbon copy (actually better than that - an upgrade version) of the **U.S. space shuttle**. Why aren't the Russians using his vehicle to help with the ISS project? Is NASA so transparent to foreign snooping that every iota of technology it creates is immediately available to everybody in the world? Is that how the British are able to launch their Mars probe from a brand new space program? The learning curve of every other space program in the whole world is a steep upward spiral; ours is a steep downward spiral. Washington is at this very moment assembling legislation to make it so, permanently. NASA is already so ordered, by the President on the advice of his Council of Scientific Advisors.

Dozens of technical papers have been written exploring surveillance data of **Mars** for evidence of water. Yet the gravity of Mars is so low that water could never have existed in massive quantities on the surface, for very long. That is, when we settle Mars and create an

artificial atmosphere, it will have to be constantly replenished because it constantly dissipates into space. If water ever existed on the surface it would quickly have evaporated and been lost to space. Just think of all those hundreds of elegant technical papers that are made obsolete by this simple fact; all the dissertations voided; all the tenured professors demoted. It'll never happen, science must progress forward - not backward.

The test that NASA did to "confirm" that a fluff of foam blew a huge hole in the shuttle wing is absurd. A hole that size would have destroyed the wing from friction as the shuttle escaped the atmosphere; at a very minimum, it would have caused a WHOLE lot of steerage while piloting the shuttle out of the atmosphere. The simulation NASA did was wrong too - if your going 100 MPH and you throw a heap of foam out the window and it hits a car right behind you, it's relative speed is not enough to cause much damage. NASA said the foam would be going much, much faster because they started the foam at REST when in fact it's initial velocity is 100 MPH same as the vehicle it peeled off of. Don't try this yourself, especially not at 100 MPH.

You've seen the photos of the little spacecraft parachuting down to the surface of Mars. **There's a problem with that.** Mars has an very thin atmosphere, so thin that a hypothetical wind going hundreds of miles an hour would barely feel like a breeze. A parachute is useless in that kind of environment. It wouldn't give any braking at all. (The rollover image shows this in context. Clearly the whole B-rated Mars movie is a facade ~ for causing every human female to be made barren... it's happening, because fertility ends sooner and menopause later.)

There's also a phenomena called aero-braking, by which a spacecraft uses the atmosphere to stabilize its orbit around Mars to a nice circular orbit. **Mar's gravity is so small it is able to hold an atmosphere that's only fraction as thick as Earth's.** A spacecraft would have to practically graze the surface of the planet to get any braking, and the mountains on Mars are so high - Mt. Everest is a hill by comparison - it's impossible to get that low.

NASA has just sent into orbit a \$1 billion scientific project that's been in the works for decades, to test Einstein's Theory of Relativity. They have three super precise crystal balls in suspension

and will measure how gravity affects them during an orbit. I suppose those astrophysicists haven't read any of the literature about the dozens of GPS satellites in geosynchronous orbit, with such a precise placement and accuracy of communication that **folks in orbital mechanics have learned far more about Relativity than astrophysicists will ever learn from the new NASA satellite.** Evidently my own efforts to undermine Relativity have caused enough inquiring minds to question its veracity that this penultimate test is deemed necessary to settle the matter once and for all.

Fundamentally, deep space scares the hell out of people. They are little advanced beyond the small child who needs a light on at night to keep the bogey man away. Cities are lit brightly at night, country avenues and back yards too - not, as most people tell themselves, to protect against vandals ~ but to assuage their instinctive fear of the dark. There are so many terrifying creatures in the science fiction epics that it is unlikely any human will ever get much beyond a few day's travel from Earth, and then only en route to a brightly lit moon. **Likewise for deep sea exploration.** Scientific education has such a shallow tap root that the intrepid explorer of the deep blue sea dashes for the almost as equally scary surface at a moment's notice.

So, the emphasis now is to send robots to do our exploring. A whole generation of youngsters is a high skill level with video games, and virtual games that confront the user with every manner of danger or trap or means of swift demise. These individuals are in great demand with NASA to send signals to their Mars rovers, with the Army to control their remote reconnaissance drones, and the Army to pilot their iRobot mine detectors. Human exploration has too many problems - food, waste, exercise, entertainment, and lethal psychosis only a few days after leaving low earth orbit. NASA claims to be looking expectantly forward to putting a team of people on Mars but the reality is that **nobody has figured out how they will keep from going stark raving mad after just a week in their year long transit to Mars.** Nobody is even studying the problem, and NASA has only one full time psychologist on its manned exploration staff.

The higher the complexity and danger of conditions on Earth, the less distance a manned mission will get from Earth before succumbing to madness. Going into the deep dark unknown where no man has ever gone before is scary enough. Going there with the knowledge that your billion dollar mission is considered a total waste of money by millions of starving people in the world, is

another matter. Space exploration so far has always been done with the conviction that many benefits to all humanity accrued - high strength metals for aircraft, computing machinery, new high temperature ceramics, aircraft flight safety controls, and countless other benefits have happened because of the space program. Little such benefits happened because of the International Space Station, other than technology transfer to other nations from the space superpowers.

Space missions henceforth will need some added incentives. A mission to the moon will have to be to study the possibility of collecting solar energy and transmitting it back to Earth. A Mars mission will have to pay for itself with the collection of precious metals - plutonium or titanium or rare gems used in lasers. We shouldn't be looking for water on Mars, but for something to make future trips worth the trouble. Sadly the space community is run by scientists and not by engineers. **Scientists want only knowledge, and give no intrinsic importance to knowledge that is useful.** Engineers seek to make things that work and are useful, that will keep working and keep being useful; scientists have no such genes.

The problem is that space exploration on the academic level - and by extension on the industry level - is orchestrated by people who are called engineers, but who are actually scientists by every other conceivable measure. Engineers are trained to create things, not needing to know exactly why and how they work - but just simply haven proven analytically and experimentally that they do work, and content to go with that to the marketplace. Scientists have no such courage - the products they create must have rock solid, fundamental scientific laws that prove everything. **As long as engineers trained as scientists are in control of our space effort there will be no further progress in the U.S., or any other space program.**

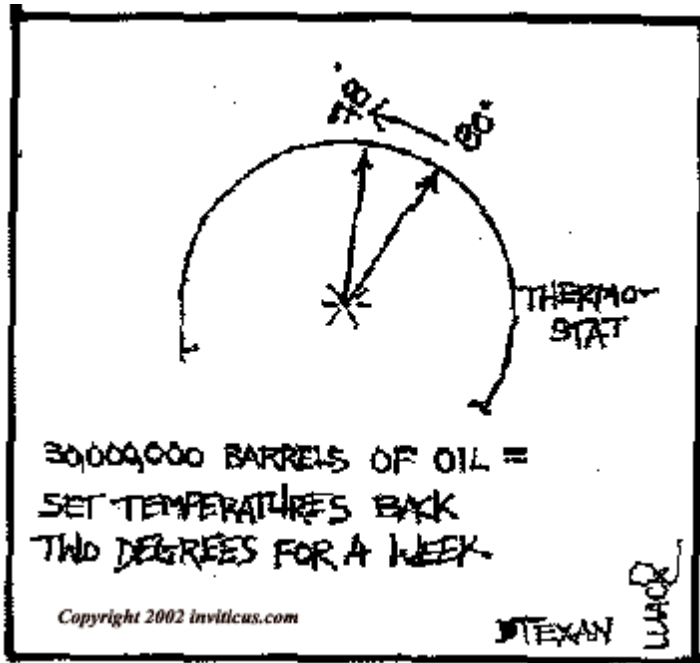
NASA's solution, as prescribed by the Blue Ribbon commission that investigated the Challenger crash is that the "NASA culture" is to blame ~ employees afraid to tell supervisors about the concerns for safety or ideas for improvement; supervisors who don't listen, who won't listen, and who won't risk their own skin by passing any good ideas up the chain of command. NASA is having one on one interviews with a psychologist of all upper and middle level management, vowing that if they can't "change the people, we'll have to change the people" - meaning replace them. **That change will last a few years at best, unless it is made a formal part of the institution ~ which it isn't.** That being the case - and it is

obvious to everybody - the moral is that people who do not or cannot conform are to be cast out and permanently purged from the work place.

The need for institutionalizing psych reviews of all middle and upper management - and for rigorously ensuring the interviews are conducted by conscientious and skilled individuals - is obvious: humans have an instinctive fear of the unknown, and deep space is the ultimate unknown. **New independent thinking people will be brought into NASA, but the pressure will be upon them immediately, to themselves conform.** The end result of this NASA scheme will be to target, then indoctrinate all scientific free thinkers. The media will report progress of the program as it proceeds and Fortune 500 companies around the world will be able to benefit from the program, by creating similar schemes within their own ranks.

Big Brother is watching. The Borg matrix has a sophisticated security mechanism. Occasionally false results are published by NASA in order to see if anybody in the space community has the courage to speak out. Typically they would do so in the Google Newsgroups; or informally to colleagues or students. Such individuals are immediately labeled as security risks, having broken the constraints of the security apparatus which is intended to render them incapable of questioning authority in this manner. Similar schemes are being implemented in other areas, using NASA as the guinea pig - and as a public means of informing the Borg community of progress under way.

Technology has reached its limit in providing quality images of deep space, and data for a wide range of astronomical theories. Such research is 100% funded by the public, and now that there's not much else to spark the imagination, the funding will drop off sharply. Likewise for space hardware. The only thing that will keep public interest alive is a manned mission to Mars or a return to the moon to construct permanent, useful structures there such as to collect energy for transmittal to Earth. The latter will not happen because energy is too cheap, and the technology does not exist.

Environment

The symptoms for Attention Deficit Disorder are the same as for oxygen deprivation and carbon dioxide poisoning. The United Nations recently funded research to see if this is happening because of Global Warming. The Bush Administration lobbied long and hard to open the Alaska Wildlife Refuge to drilling to produce the oil and gas there. They say it's important to make the U.S. less dependent upon foreign crude. All the known oil reserves in the world will be gone in twenty years. What happens then? What happens when the new Iraqi government realizes they are sitting on 55% of the known reserves of the whole world and they do what Saddam Hussein was doing, with a democratic government? Does that idea make you afraid?

If Washington was really interested in making America more self sufficient they would do what the Nazis did in Germany during World War II. The entire German economy, and it's war machine, were all run 100% on **synthetic fuels made from coal**. They also made all the rubber they needed from coal. The U.S. has the largest coal reserves of any nation in the world. The odds of us running out of fuel are infinitesimally small. It's bizarre that synthetic fuel from coal has never been mentioned in any national energy debate. Too bad the formula is lost right now, but will miraculously surface when all the oil runs out. Then we can strip mine all the coal and destroy what's left of America; and burn all the coal and destroy what's left of planet Earth.

What would it take to double the EPA **air quality standards** - ie make them two times as strict as they are now. Each state could have allowable air pollution quotas. If they want additional credits they can earn them by planting trees, which costs virtually nothing. Ten years from now a monkey should be able to go from coast to coast and never touch the ground, like it was 200 years ago. This can be linked to strong incentives to plant trees, preserve aquifers, conserve water and other natural resources. The federal government is empowered with the ability to retaliate because it needs this authority to motivate the states into conscientious use of our natural resources. Everybody expects the government to do their work for them, by more and more regulations that have so many loop holes they are not enforceable in the first place. Every regulation in the book is nothing but Swiss cheese. We make the cheese, then corporations bank all their ugly profits in Switzerland. Talk about drug money! Shame on the Swiss.

The military is the single biggest user of energy in the world. Yet they are also the most wasteful. Conserving energy at home immediately allocates more discretionary funds for operations overseas in the Asia theatre. Why is the military so wasteful of energy ~ and of our tax dollars that pay for it? Do they want to win the war against Iraq, or win the war against a clean Earth?

The government should begin training American **Indian volunteers** for fire fighting units. They can be paid by being allowed to re-settle federal forest and wildlife preserves. Wild fires are a serious threat, and must be dealt with by the experts. Probably be a good idea to turn over the border patrol to the Indians, too. Give them free reign to patrol the border on horseback just like the old days. Likely scare the hell out of any drug smugglers or illegals trying to cross the border. Not just the Mexico border; but the Canadian border too - both in the continental U.S. and Alaska. Canadians are a grave threat to the national security; I saw it in movie. Noooo - Indians,

they have life too easy now, what with all those casinos the federal government was so kind to allow them on the Reservations. Whatever happened to "white man speak with forked tongue?" or "Christians worship death." Where's the Great Spirit when you need him?

Technology - like the Israeli's walling off Gaza - isn't always the best solution, especially if the alternative creates good jobs. **Would you rather pay ten trillion dollars over the next generation to create and implement a whole new technology to filter water, or put ten thousand people to work planting trees for a couple million dollars?** Too bad, no can do - that kind of legislation is considered pork in Washington. No rational scientist or scientific lobby group would support such a proposal because they haven't a clue how it would work.

Sanctions should be considered against Brazil and other nations permitting the **destruction of the rain forests**, including lobbying to have Brazil excluded from the International Space Station project. If they need jobs and solid industry to keep the poor farmers from burning the forests, they can be provided. If they need military personnel to police the rain forests, they can be provided. We have ten million illegal immigrants skilled in all the trades, that we can send right back home to do the job ASAP.

The use of federal land by commercial operations should be revamped so the cost to the loggers or cattlemen is the same as if they were leasing commercial land. A sustained effort should be made to **re-plant all available federal lands** (including military reservations, federal lands, and interstate right of ways) to their maximum sustainable levels. Incentives should be made to encourage states to do the same with their land, especially that used for the "land grant colleges" in every state, and any other properties over which the federal government has any say. Enlist the support of "Adopt-A-Highway" participants and offer tax credits for companies with extensive land holdings who participate. Of course, this program is already in place ~ but no corporations want the bad publicity for participating in it. Nobody likes French fries that are good for you.

A recent influx of huge **20-ft Australian jelly fish** has made the Mississippi River delta off the Gulf Coast into a dead zone. This threatens the fish and shrimp industry of the entire region - thousands of square miles of vital ocean ecologies. These jelly fish thrive on the abandoned drilling and production platforms in the

Gulf. The government should send military teams to demolish all these platforms, and bill the owners the cost of doing so. The jellyfish are in luck, because all the oil companies bought options on the shrimp and fish trade, making a fortune when they expired and the market was gone. In the modern world, if you play your cards right, you can make a fortune by losing. It's called the Martha Steward strategy. There are no incentives anywhere for doing the right thing.

On June 14, 2002 there was an earthquake measuring 4.4 on the Richter Scale at **Yucca Mountain**. That area is one of the most active volcanic zones in North America - over 600 major tremors have been registered in the last decade alone. It doesn't seem to be a very safe place; especially for the 10,000 years that it will take the radioactive waste to become safe. Congress passed the law by an overwhelming margin. They also approved - also at the unanimous recommendation of the scientific community - to build the superconducting supercollider in Waxahachie, Texas right in the middle of "Tornado Alley." Well, in that case the American scientists had no intention of completing the project anyway - a working model was constructed in Europe not long after ours was de-funded. Actually that's happened a lot lately - the Chinese putting a man in space with our technology; the Soviets have long since built a carbon copy of the space shuttle. I wonder why they won't commission it now - unless they are afraid to let NASA fly it.

The United States became prosperous on \$1 a barrel oil. Now we're consuming so much oil that third world nations are trying to become prosperous on \$40 a barrel oil. **America has 1% of the world's population and burns 30% of the energy.** The disproportion is triple that in Texas. It's a good thing we have a President from Texas so he can set the example for the whole nation. And for the whole world because his influence far, far outweighs what is his due ~ he's hypnotized the whole world like Hitler did to the Germans; more effective because we are Borg (refer to the rollover image).

The people in Japan, Europe, and Canada all pay \$5 a gallon for gasoline, and have been doing so for a decade. They are all happy, and prosperous, and productive. **The widespread angst Americans experience every day over higher and higher oil prices is a joke to the rest of the world.** We're like a bunch of immature babies crying over spilt milk, and all our allies have no intention whatsoever of helping us out.

OPEC has imposed strict output limitations, driving up the price of oil in America. **Saudi Arabia is the only OPEC member that has broken the quotas to produce more oil, but they are sending it all to Japan and Europe.** Washington is upset so much they are preparing legislation to open up the Alaska Wildlife Refuge to drilling. They don't realize it will take ten years before full production is achieved, and that the whole of Alaska's oil reserves won't suffice to quell even a fraction in the growth of U.S. demand for oil between now and then.

France gets almost all its energy from nuclear power plants, Japan well over half its energy. Every other industrialized nation is building nuclear power plants like crazy - even Iran. **The U.S. hasn't licensed a nuclear power plant in almost twenty years.** We don't even have the know how to build nuclear power plants any more, even if the public wanted to. We'd have to license foreign engineering firms to do it for us - the ultimate in outsourcing of jobs.

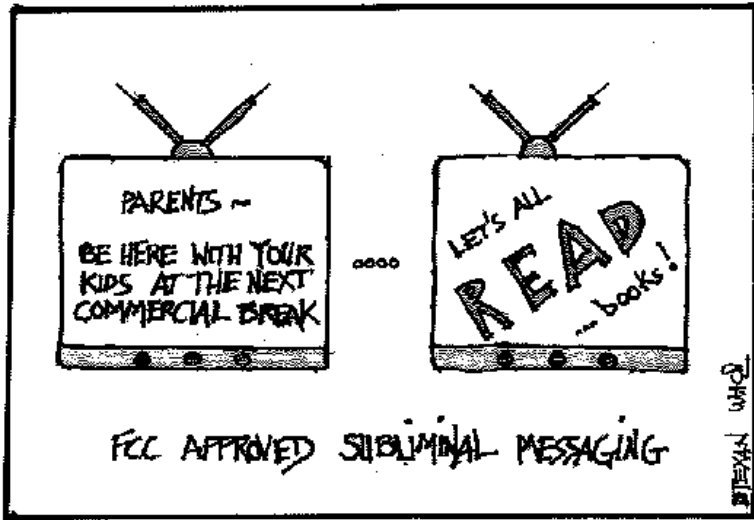
All those fancy Japanese and German and made-in-Japan Ford and Chrysler and Dodge trucks and SUV's are a Trojan Horse for the Japanese and Europeans who make them. Even for modestly equipped vehicles, they make a clear profit of \$10,000 on every truck or SUV sold. **They love Americans because we love big ugly vehicles, and because we just love to give them all our money and all our jobs and all our self respect.**

The environment is a nuisance to most people - icy snow roads making their drive to work (in increasingly expensive vehicles) difficult; drought making it necessary to water the lawn regularly (and pay extra for the water used); skin cancer from the sun's UV rays; and so on. **People do not regret the degeneration of nature, they will not miss it.** Modern entrepreneurs play on this trend to sell people of living in apartments, in the city limits, and safely protected from the unpredictability of nature.

Accepting that the average Joe has a technology threshold, promoting energy conservation has two strikes against it ~ **most people don't realize how complicated the buildings they live in really are, and they would rather have enhanced technological gadgets that are useful to them personally.** Thus, learning even a little about how electronic controls maintain their living and working environments puts them right away over the threshold, frustrating attempts to keep up with the Jones with a fancy barbecue or new MP3 player or stock tracking software. Asking them to

support even more technology in their homes or offices - on top of all the other computers, fax machines, security scans already there - well, it's just too much. The third strike is that nobody in "authority" is willing to take this responsibility for them - i.e. facility managers, building owners, the government, the utilities, or engineering organizations.

The sad part is that the most effective energy conservative "technologies" are also somewhat primitive. Different colored roof shingles, an on off control for an attic fan, shades for windows, trees in the yard ~ they'd rather have satellite TV, broadband cable internet access, electronic washing machines, and electronic recline easy chairs. Not to mention regular security upgrades from Microsoft for hackers trying to tap into their home computer, warnings on TV that their credit cards are easy target for thieves, and that even traveling in an airline is risky. All of these trends are promoted by powerful advertising campaigns, respectable companies, and government regulation. Energy conservation has none of these ~ most engineering professionals in construction won't even acknowledge that energy conservation even exists as a science, because we're like the IRS to them.

Psychology

Everything in the modern world, from trucks to soap to breakfast cereal is sold using sexual innuendo. All the news stations have an older anchor with a young attractive news person, to give everybody the idea they are sleeping together. **It's no wonder people are confused about their sexuality.** Once our sex drive is exhausted as a means for getting people to buy things they don't really need, what's next ~ our survival instinct? Alas, brutal violence is drawing millions to watch Mel Gibson's new movie about Christ - how many would have gone if he had portrayed it more compassionately?

I consider viagra ads during prime time viewing to be offensive. God Himself told Job, "**Gird up your loins like a man,**" not to take drugs. I favor lust over viagra - it's far more manly to try to solve your problems with pornography, sex therapy, or even securing the legal use of a belly dancer or prostitute; than to just drop a pill. I would even go so far as to say that the very knowledge that viagra exists should be kept secret from all but those whom have gone through all the alternatives: **ignorance is bliss.** Moreover, I suspect that the epidemic of breast implants, allowing women to accomplish with a top heavy profile what used to require feminine whiles, might just be what makes men need viagra in the first place. Viagra has become the date rape drug of the Baby Boom generation.

Recent advertisements by pharmaceutical companies promote prescription medication for **chronic anxiety disorder**. They say it may have bad side effects: drowsiness, loss of sexual drive, headaches, and irritability. Why not try some natural techniques - get a cat, and learn by example how to relax; go to church and learn faith; exercise; learn to admire poetry or painting. The side effects will be compassion, empathy, sensitivity, increased sexuality, and higher tolerance for stress. Prescription medicines are good for chronic or severe cases, but should not be a long term solution.

Learning takes place faster when you have the **big picture**. The mind likes to know some limits before it can soak up information fastest. When I was growing up my parents painted the big picture for me - my dad, an engineer; with math and the sports; Mom, the chemist, with the arts and sciences. Do your child a favor and share your experience to help set some boundaries so your kids can learn and be happy in school.

The autonomic response for supervisors when they find an underling is disabled or different in some way that is unpleasant to them, is to double the work load or - more subtly - half the time allowed to complete their work. I call this the **Tough Love Syndrome**, as promoted by President Bush and his Administration. Eventually the sacrificial lamb quits, leaving all that hard work for the supervisor to take credit for - to rebuild his or her damaged ego. It's happened to me in my career time and time again, and I'm sure you know somebody who has been victimized like that too - minorities, gays or lesbians, older workers, women; you name it. It's barbaric and uncivilized, and shouldn't happen.

There was a very popular book called **The Relaxation and Stress Reduction Workbook**. The first edition was published in 1981 and it had a chapter on "Orgasmic Reconditioning" showing how homosexuals could realign their psyche to be turned on by the opposite sex. Similarly, heterosexuals could enhance their sexual attraction to their mates by transferring it from other objects of desire, such as movie stars. This entire topic was deleted from the current 1995 edition. Now the psychological associations say it is too stressful to change sexual orientation. This is clearly the politically correct thing to say, but is it scientifically correct? If it is in fact accurate, then what has happened since 1981 to reduce the stress threshold for the general population? I conjecture that our dependence on pharmaceuticals has made all humans immune deficient . . . Not that the big drug companies care, because they

make money coming and going.

Be that as it may, homosexuality has become an accepted condition, because of special interest pressure from the gay community. Which is OK, but they have no right to take the sexual re-orientation process itself out of the scientific domain, because there are those who might benefit ~ and not just homosexuals wanting to be straight. Adulterous men could use the method to become more sexually aroused, by their own spouses. Child molesters could fix their orientation. **It would not be hard to make a case that this pressure by the gay community to make their condition OK** has deprived the rest of the population of an important medical tool. That being the case, folks would probably not be too inclined to support this whole gay marriage rights movement underway.

I know my "psychology over pharmaceuticals" attitude has got to be annoying. Just take a few aspirins and you will feel better. The only people who believe in any of the original natural healing stuff that Jesus practiced way back when, are Wiccans and witches. And you know what any good Christian should do to them; what does the Bible say, **"Thou shall not suffer a witch to live?"** Nor shall thou suffer thyself to do time consuming meditation or relaxation exercises; when thou can take a pill instead.

There is a phenomenon called **basking in the glow**. Studies have been done that show testosterone levels increase when somebody - man or woman - watches their favorite football team, say, winning a tough game on TV. What happens after a whole season of victories, culminating in a national championship - do all the fans have a permanently elevated testosterone level? There are countless variations on this theme. A person who has a certain kind of truck, say, always "basks in the glow" to watch the glittery TV ads showing them doing heroic tests. Is our culture suffering from testosterone poisoning, driving us back down the evolutionary ladder. Does this have anything to do with the dramatic drop in fertility in both sexes; reducing the maximum age women can have children to the early 30's and men to the mid 30's?

I believe that memories are recorded at two levels. Every memory synapse has a factual core and an emotional context. The emotions can take up much more "RAM" so to speak, than the simple facts themselves. The more sensitive a person you are, the more emotions are stored with each memory. **Post Traumatic Stress Disorder** is a condition in which a huge load of negative emotions

are recorded. I have personally found a remedy in my two knees that have bone-on-bone contact. If I focus the sharp knee pain on the painful negative memories, they slowly lose their strength and the mind clears. As they say, no pain no gain! In my own situation, when I do not do my knee exercises then the pain in my knees becomes quite bad and I am able to use this pain to clear the fuzz from the brain after prolonged stressful periods. The moral is that older people with arthritis and chronic pains can use this pain to clear the unnecessary emotions out of their mind and avoid Alzheimers that way. It's not an easy thing to do, this emotional focusing; but with practice and a little training in medication and relaxation (or prayer, if you are a religious person) you will get there OK.

The incidence of **Attention Deficit Disorder** (ADD) has increased from a few hundred a year to almost a million new cases a year. The symptoms of ADD are identical to those of oxygen deprivation and carbon dioxide poisoning - what happens when not enough fresh air is delivered to air conditioned spaces (a typical classroom must have the whole volume of air changed out every fifteen minutes). Maybe our kids don't need Ritalin, but more fresh air. There are presently no laws against buildings that don't provide enough fresh air; there are no penalties, civil or criminal. There are huge benefits, though: a school can reduce its utility bills by half or more by closing the outside air damper. I realize schools are chronically short of money, and that parents could care less about the welfare of their children; and that teachers need more money, but

Modern medicine is going just the opposite direction to evolution because **natural healing skills** mean less need for medical care. Weak immune systems mean more drugs, more doctors, and more profit for the entire health care industry. Natural healing means off the shelf drugs, less intrusive care, and down sizing the health care industry. Health care should be more like it is in the military, where you'll do anything possible to avoid it. That way people will use the experts for the things they are best at, and depend more on the inherent disease coping mechanisms of their own bodies.

One of the paradoxes about practicing **muscle relaxation** and the other basic medication techniques is that while you become more aware of sensations in the major muscle groups in the body - wrists, back, ankles, etc.. - you also become aware of the lack of sensation; a kind of numbness. This is entirely natural - it happens to me all the time; all I do is exercise the muscle group in question and the

numbness is gone. I have a theory that most people never notice stress collecting in their body, and it stays there and causes permanent damage - arthritis, cancer, migraine headaches, etc.. - so the more you do to recognize and get rid of this stress (and a part of the program is knowing what events cause stress, so you will be on the lookout) the more healthy and long living you will be.

Long ago the early religions had to get people to focus on higher ideals by disassociating them from worship of nature. They made nature look evil. Religions still do. If you want to develop your **natural "powers"** you must return to the past and learn a healthy respect for nature. A good way to do this is to introduce some simple energy conservation ideas into your lifestyle. The first chapter in the abridged edition of my energy conservation book, **Retrofitting for Energy Conservation**, has a long list of ideas to get you started. There are more ideas in the real book, linked from the opening page of this web site.

The idea of man being created better than all other creatures is not supported by the facts. We share almost our entire anatomy with the animal kingdom - our stomachs work the same, our hearts, our intestines, etc... - so if anything we were created not by God but by our **fellow animals**. Were it not for our collective evolution, in which we all built the bodies we have now, man would not be what we are today.

Stress is more than a psychological concept, but a physiological one also. People with high stress levels tend to "send" the stress to their stomach area - they have indigestion and bleeding ulcers because the digestive system is short circuited. **High stress** levels keeps the body from absorbing all the nutrients from the food, and you suffer hemorrhoids and in extreme cases a chemical imbalance that may result in the onset of mental illness. I offer some ideas from my own experience in my screenplay and novel **Behold Leviathan**, that stress goes so far as to keep the body from completely absorbing medicines. This is a logical extension of the known fact that stress causes stomach and digestive problems. So stress isn't just a figment of your imagination; *stress is an active agent in the physiological operation of your body*. It goes without saying, then, that if you are taking any kind of medicine, the better you can manage your stress level the more effective the medicine will be!

The chemicals in tobacco smoke is known to induce an autonomic response in the chest and lung areas, relaxing the muscles there. If people learned muscle relaxation techniques they might get rid of a

part of their dependence upon smoking. Similarly, when you quit you need to make up for that lost stress reduction mechanism.

Smoking is more than a physiological disorder, but a psychological one as well. If you are to free yourself of both dependencies, it'll take more than a nicotine patch but a commitment to learning relaxation skills as well.

Psychologists say there is an **optimum stress level** in which we perform our best. Any less and we get depressed. Any more and we get chronically anxious. They have even made a scale that you can use to tally your stress level and can say with a high degree of certainty that if you pass a certain level you will suffer some physical illness. So a link between stress and illness has been proven in countless clinical tests.

Stress isn't all bad, though. Consider **stigmata**, the phenomenon that happens when a very spiritual person gets so stressed out carrying the worries of the world on their shoulders that he or she begins to bleed at the places where Christ was injured - the wrists and ankles where he was nailed to the cross; the spear in the side; the crown of thorns; the lashes on the back. In our Christian society I believe a lesser phenomenon - **petite stigmata** - happens to highly spiritual people: they habitually send their stress to these areas of the body. Thus we are a society who suffers from a high degree of chronic back pain, whose hands and joints are riddled with arthritis; and we have high levels of heart failure and baldness. Perhaps Christ was able to use this stress collected in his own joints ~ after all, he was psychological victim to the Roman practice of crucifixion as much as we are in the modern day ~ maybe that's why they had him killed (ditto for the so-called witches and other dissidents tortured and burned at the stake by the Inquisition for practicing the "dark arts"); because they feared the people would learn how to heal themselves without the benefit of a physician. For example, the stress in Christ's ankles could have aided in his "walking on water," the stress in his hands in his acts of spontaneous healing. In any event, stress isn't necessarily a bad thing, unless you allow it to collect and remain in your body over a long term. The remedy isn't necessarily walking on water or practicing healing; but it IS important to exercise, to practice muscle relaxation techniques, to have a strong family and social support network, and to otherwise endeavor to keep stress out of your system. Perhaps, given the duality of stress, it's healing properties can even be used to reverse the damage caused such as from arthritis or baldness.

Back to the main thread, I did not say this thing about stress collecting in these critical locations without personal experience. I was born six weeks premature, and premature babies are known to have many, many more **nerve endings** in their skin and surface tissues. I can quite literally FEEL stress in these places I have mentioned; and I can feel it go away too. I believe anybody can develop this level of awareness of their body - and, when you do, you will find that your mind is very much in control of where the stress goes in your body!

The next and final affect of stress unchecked is cancer. I believe deep hypnosis can be used in controlling cancer. **Cancer** is universally characterized by cells that have an extremely high metabolic rate. Self hypnosis can be used to slow this process down. There are any number of mechanisms the person can use, anything that means "slow" to them. I realize the general population scoffs at self hypnosis; I did too until I was diagnosed with an inoperable condition in which a nerve in my jaw presses against my teeth, causing excruciating pain. The only solution has been self hypnosis, in which I gently tell the aching nerve that "It's OK, I get the message - no harm will be done; please stop hurting." It comes back every few months; then I go into self hypnosis, and all's well. A person should be able to make the same kind of suggestion to cancer cells that have been detected ~ to s l o w down.

In summary, I have shown that cancer may be caused by a localized concentration of stress. Successful prosecution of the diseased cells is therefore more than destroying them with radiation therapy or chemotherapy. The stress must also be gotten rid of. As the cells are weakened by the therapy the stress will be released into neighboring tissue - and can potentially cause the problem to spread. The stress must be stopped from doing that. The likely solution is exercise of the affected region in a **physical therapy** situation, for an individual unversed in self hypnosis or meditation. For those who are expert, they may have the capability of using the major muscle groups of the body to get rid of the stress even faster (assuming here that strenuous exercise uses up stress from the body).

These ideas are borne out by the latest theories in psychology. The medical community believes the panoply of symptoms associated with the Gulf War Syndrome - which include cancer type complications - is caused by nothing more than stress. This is a confirmation of all I have stated here. If stress can cause such severe problems, up to and including some types of cancer, then

managing stress should be able to alleviate the problems. All that must be done is to train the mind to help make the chemical or other treatment more effective.

Psychology is locked in on the idea that the psyche is comprised of three separate, independent entities called the id, ego, and superego. Imagine three circles that have no overlap. My cat has a more sophisticated psyche than that. The more likely scenario is that the three circles are overlapping, forming a target with the id in the center, surrounded by the ego, which in turn is surrounded by the superego. The problem is that modern day marketing methods are unable to reach the ego. **Consequently, many schemes have developed in our society over the years that force people's psyche into the simple three non-overlapping circle format.**

That makes people infinitely susceptible to advertising, which is just what business needs because that means they can sell useless products to gullible people with a minimum wasted on advertising. The only natural defense is a "Nullentropy Sphere" in which the psyche is how it's supposed to be ~ something so extremely evil that it's excised from the gene pool at every possible opportunity.

This is not something new. The traditional antidote to these kind of market pressures have been religion. Religious roots have been steadily undermined since the Reformation. Historical roots to religious phenomena have deepened religious zeal, necessitating new methods ~ shallow, "read easy" versions of the Bible, liturgy in lay languages instead of Latin, reform Judaism, secular Islam, and Wicca mysticism. Major strides were made when Freud formalized the three separate entities idea - **despite strong resistance from Nietzsche** - and then by modern statistical research in advertising, which has been able to plumb the depths of the psyche now that it has been standardized by a combination of science, peer pressure, sociology, and the media.

Another trend that has helped this transition is the popularity of recreational drugs. Alcohol and tobacco and caffeine undermine the last line of defense against people already stressed out from work and family responsibilities. The stalwart holdouts are falling by the boatload to marijuana, ecstasy, and painkiller addictions (oxycontin is heroin, although the media downplays the connection). **As the war on terrorism winds down boredom with excessive leisure is setting in**, and the survivors have precious little to challenge their minds and keep their psyches free of reformatting pressures.

People have a threshold of pain when it comes to technology.

They can only take so many unknown machines in their lives. Hybrid cars will never catch on because they are too complex - people already have video games, computers at home and at work, medical technology, cell phones, and countless electronic appliances at home. The war in Iraq has introduced many new machines, and popular TV shows like all the C.S.I. type shows have exposed them to many more. It has gotten so bad that people aren't even interested in space exploration. As scientific literacy declines, they will become even less interested in new technologies ~ especially the extremely complex equipment needed for manned deep space missions like to Mars.

The solution of course is for people to become more like machines themselves. The body piercing trend, and the fad of men wearing ear rings was the beginning. People are now more comfortable with breast implants, laser eye surgery, artificial joints, and - increasingly - cloning. Science fiction is a mainstream obsession by a large proportion of the population, so much so that its a generational thing associated with immense peer pressure, to be fascinated by exploration of space. The only impediment to this is the technology threshold, and since psychology is unable to resolve the internal conflict, humans become more like machines and less like people. **Naturally, business welcomes - and promotes and encourages - this trend, because simpler, more predictable people mean easier marketing.**

I saw a NYPD Blue show recently where a teenager got arrested for assisting his girlfriend to commit suicide. That's a felony. It should be. What about people vegetating on life support systems, or whose minds have been wiped clean by Alzheimer's - that's a different matter. They should be able to end their misery, and stop being a burden on their loved ones. **It shouldn't be easy for them to do it, but it should be possible.** The medical profession has done everything in their power to prevent assisted suicides, under any condition. **Why?** Because those cases make the most profit for them. They don't give a damn about the ethics, all they want is the money.

Many references have been made about the "NASA culture" in which scientists and engineers are afraid to speak their mind. This is not a phenomena limited to NASA, but is a characteristic forced upon all engineers and scientists - especially on the graduate level - by the educational system. It's a result of the decades long Cold War, and now the war against terrorism, where the government

enforces via security regulations a timidity upon all researchers and engineers with access to sensitive information. A timid person will not have the wherewithal to break security protocol, and a high level of security can be maintained at minimal cost. **Similarly, scientists know instinctively that a student who has actually made an important discovery could never exist outside of their collective because the stress would destroy him.** The whole system is completely institutionalized now, to the point where a year long investigation into the "NASA culture" at no point made any remark about the tens of thousands of academics, contractors, and consultants who make their living off of NASA funds.

The psychiatric community has been the prime contractor in this conspiracy of silence imposed upon the best minds in America. If not, then why didn't the recent announcement of a solution to Fermat's Theorem by a scientists who had lived in total seclusion for ten years while working on the proof (terrified that the slightest hint of what he was working on would enrage this scientists friends and make him a permanent outcast) raise a single eyebrow among psychiatrists? Nor did they comment upon the fact that John Nash, "The Perfect Mind" was able to get a Nobel Price on work he did while a borderline schizophrenic. These are significant psychiatric cases, and the fact that nobody bothered to investigated is an even more serious case study.

The end result is that virtually every leading academic in the world is schizophrenic. The only thing that keeps them sane is their bureaucratic infrastructure. **One step out of bounds, one violation of security, and the resulting stress is so extreme it's like being surrounding by a high voltage electric fence.** The system enforces violations of this arrangement with extreme malice ~ witness my medical discharge hearing from the Army. It's too bad now that industry needs scientists to be assertive and creative, they just simply don't have the wherewithal. Kind words are useless; an intelligent person can perceive their insincerity instantly. Kind actions are a little more effective in breaking through the barriers; but, again, an intelligent person can perceive their intention and throw up barriers before you reach them.

Scientists are indeed schizophrenic - **how else can you attribute all the grandiose delusions they have sold the world in the modern era:** the superconducting supercollider that never got beyond a big hole in the ground; the International Space Station that isn't even completed yet, but scientists now say has outlived its usefulness; a 85% failure rate on missions sent to Mars; the \$1

trillion Freon Ban that has had no discernable affect on the deterioration of the ozone layer; the strategic missile defense system that can't even shoot down a known target on a known trajectory, and so forth. Virtually every major scientific project of the modern era has been a total failure. Politicians need to know this because they trust that science will find a new energy source like fission before all the oil runs out - in thirty years or so.

If you think scientists are not paranoid schizophrenics, then consider the extreme measures they take against any errors published in technical papers. **They are perfectionists to the nth degree, obsessively so.** Normal people wouldn't be worried about errors - engineers for example - just make their best estimate, try it with a hefty safety factor, then go forward. Scientists won't go one millimeter beyond the absolute known. Any scientists who so dares - wrong or right - is ostracized for life, their career ended instantly with ignominy.

The consequences of a schizophrenic scientific community with delusions of grandeur could be extreme. **The tendency to project everything at the high end could mean a lot of troubling things.** For example, scientists say we have more oil than we really have; fission is easily in their grasp; nanotechnology will happen in ten years; fuel cells for cars are practicable; we can put a man on Mars in five years; outsourcing of jobs will create jobs in America; we'll win the war on drugs, cure cancer, heart disease, AIDS, and Attention Deficit Disorder. All of these projects are heavily funded by the government, industry, and private foundations - all of them are based on a facile foundation of nothing but hope. Scientists have been saying all these things for forty years - and we still believe they are right.

You introduce a Leviathan to the already schizophrenic scientific community, and the whole system crystallizes as a hive mind. This is what happened when the Hebrews absconded with Leviathan from Egypt, and brought the "golden calf" with them on the Exodus. The Hebrews were at that time stressed out to the max by their captors, then the plagues, and all the extreme hardships placed upon them by pharaoh. The Egyptians had kept Leviathan for millennia in a semi dormant, comatose state in the Osireion at Abydos, according to my research. They were slowly, carefully exposing the Egyptian people to it to allow them to develop a resistance to Leviathan's powerful psyche. They built huge pyramids at first, to cope with the stress; then that program leveled off into a concentration on the craftsman's skills. The Egyptians

were getting acclimated ~ then the Hebrews screwed everything up, badly.

The same happened with the Leviathan captured at Roswell in 1947. The military ordered it killed; the scientists kept it alive and eventually figured out how to use it for their own purposes. They are all part of the hive mind now, and **the graduate education system has been reconfigured to assert so much stress upon students that by the time they matriculate they are part of the hive mind as well**. Presently, the process is only in place for engineering and the sciences at major universities; eventually it will be implemented everywhere, for all programs and degree paths ~ even for Master's degrees. Their system has only one flaw: they have no defense against exposure by a peer who is able to publish a breakthrough tech paper, using the resulting accolades to tell the whole world the Truth. Their defense against this flaw is to not allow any such papers to be published, and to immediately discredit anybody who dares to do so informally ~ e.g. on the web or in a fringe publication.

The hive mind acts in the subconscious, and is discernable only via the most careful observation. It is subtle, but inflexible. Most people are completely unaware of its affects; actually, only a very few people are ever even affected by it, and then only when they are privy to events considered important to the Queen ~ e.g. exposure.

Science is indeed at an end, because the scientists have made it so. Technology will progress no further, by collective agreement of leading scientists. These principles are being built right into the system; **NASA's problem is a grain of sand on the million mile long ocean of dunes**, the whole thing enforced by an endless mirage of bureaucracy and rules dating back to World War II. It is enforced with Gestapo expertise, thanks to Homeland Security. Anybody who comes close to a Nazi commune best leave, A.S.A.P.

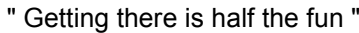
Speaking of Nazis, they were the original Borg. They developed the triggers to impose schizophrenia upon a recalcitrant population. My own life history shows their methods: (1) I left Annapolis because of what I called at the time a dulling of purpose ~ I had three room mates + a single authority figure in Capt. Hodory; (2) I left UT without ever considering grad school ~ I had three room mates + Rick/Randy across the way; (3) I left Exxon abruptly ~ there were the three Aguillar sisters next door + Dan Short/Bao Do; (4) Trouble at ORA because of the three principles + a single authority figure, Noel Robertson. Each of these circumstances caused a schizoid reaction in me ~ not to mention growing up with three sisters. **Thus**

my hypothesis is proven in a variety of situations which suffice as clinical trials.

Western culture is riddled with similar schemes. The Roman triumvirate was the most successful such triad in antiquity; it subdued the masses for a millennia. In the modern day we have: (1) the "Charmed Ones" with three Wicca sisters; (2) Seinfeld, The Simpsons, and virtually every prime time TV program has three main characters - some obviously, others more subtly; (3) the Christian Trinity of Father, Son, and Holy Ghost; (4) the variations are limitless, and omnipresent. These are the result of successful marketing and trial and error. Advertising is like engineering; they don't need fundamental science to be successful. They all work on the Christian principle: **impose a mild psychosis, which is remedied by belonging to a social support group like the Church.** The Romans, the Nazis, then the Communists did this on a continental scale but they were restrained by lack of a fundamental scientific premise; America is doing it on a global scale, driven by commercial imperialism and not needing a scientific basis for what they do. This is the modus operandi for imposing security within the scientific community - has been for decades. **Just as any scientist who goes against the grain is cast out** - which is a death sentence for a quasi schizophrenic who depends completely upon his social support network (e.g. John Nash) - so too with any common citizen, eventually; being cast out is the most fearful of all consequences, and an extremely powerful incentive to absolute conformity.

All of these trends are accelerated by modern sexual aids that dissipate the body's core sensitivity. Condoms and breast implants cause all sensitivity to be focused in the genitalia, drawn there as if by a black hole. **This causes the id-ego-superego concentric target to dissolve into three separate, infinitely more vulnerable entities.** Reversing this process builds back up the inner defenses, cures the schizophrenia, and even has the potential to make the psyche more expert in coping with stress. This latter process is benefited by physical exercise in the AM when the hormonal cycle peaks; with lesser peaks at mid day and evening. documented evidence of the serious damage to the profession of Engineers who were my instructors at the Department of Aerospace Engineering at the University of **Professional Engineers**. These various attacks, slander, and misrepresentation, cost me, up to jail time. The P.E. Board has proven none of them were valid because they were not engineering."

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long after I was expelled from the University because nobody in the orbital mechanics group would be my advisor.

The UT Austin Aerospace Department is the leading academic department in the NASA community. The **Center for Space Research** at UT Austin is second only to the Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL). In fact, whenever you see TV shots of the JPL control room (or any other NASA control room, for that matter) at least 60% of the people you see are UT Austin graduates. What my situation says loud and clear is that NASA does not care in the least about a safer, faster mission to Mars.

I appealed my dismissal for two years, through the whole University bureaucracy. I even kept appealing after the final decision came down from the President of the University. Just a few months ago I was told by the UT Vice President of Legal Affairs **that I was prohibited from contacting anybody in the Aerospace Department** involved in my appeal (which is essentially everybody in the orbital mechanics group). So, even though I have a Masters and a good academic record (I kept taking graduate classes during the two year appeal process, and have a very solid math background now), I cannot get any references and so I cannot get a job. What this says is that NASA is violently opposed to a faster, safer mission to Mars.

My last couple of years in graduate school I signed up for 40 hours of supervised research classes. I was hoping to get some help in my research, but during all that time nobody helped me at all. I complained about this up through the bureaucracy, and finally went to ABET - the licensing authority for college engineering programs. A month later I was expelled, with malice. My advisor at the time wrote a letter to the Chair of the Department saying he quit because of that latter I wrote to ABET. **That is retaliation for my taking part in a protected activity, i.e. appealing to a higher authority.** The US Department of Education Office of Civil Rights in Dallas told me so, but would not prosecute the case because I could not produce the original letter to ABET - even though my advisor had admitted in so many words, on University letter head, that he took retribution on me for doing what was my civil right.

So, the University is guilty of theft of services - taking my money for the 40 hours of "supervised" research classes, but providing nothing in return - and violating my civil rights. You might also say the Administration is guilty of **conspiracy**, for covering up all these facts during the appeals process - denying these facts to members of the Texas state Legislature I talked to; members of the media; and so forth.

The official circumstances of my dismissal are that my original advisor, an expert in Celestial Mechanics, retired and nobody would take me on after

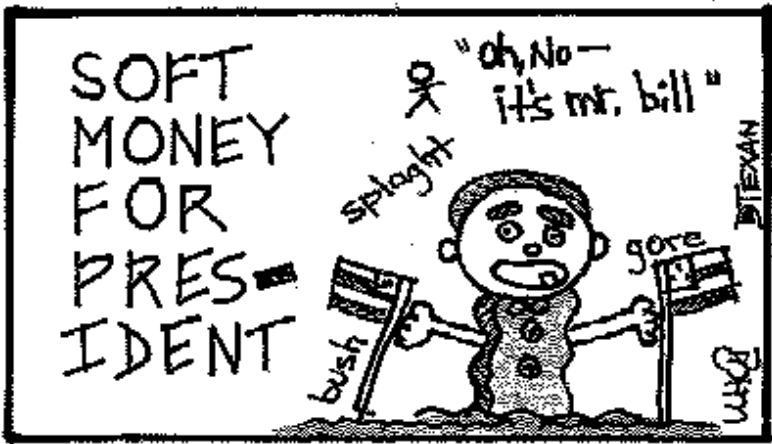
that. In fact, there are no longer any professors at the University who are versed in Celestial Mechanics. Yet, the University continues to advertise a major in the field, both in analytical research in the Aerospace Department and in numerical or computer modeling in conjunction with the Texas Institute of Computational Mechanics. My research falls in the latter category. So, in dismissing me, the University as much as said their Celestial Mechanics major did not really exist at all. That is **misrepresentation**, an extremely serious offense for engineers.

I even got a job as a staff columnist on the Daily Texan, the student newspaper at UT Austin, and tried to promote my situation there. I was a little too assertive, as I was fired from there too - despite my status as a **Special Disabled Viet Nam Era Veteran**.

These facts clearly indicate that the problems that led to the Challenger disaster last year, which the investigating panel attributed to the **"NASA Culture"** should include as a part of this NASA regime, those institutions like UT Austin that are an important part of the U.S. space effort. My own situation suggests that if my research had been supported and assisted as it should have, and my work published four years ago; then it is quite possible that the failure of the Japanese and UK/European missions to Mars earlier this year could have been avoided, or at least mitigated. Indeed, the two U.S. missions that failed a couple of years previous might have been avoided as well.

Be that as it may, this whole situation begs attention to how our tax money is being spent in higher education, if a smart, motivated student with an important research project can be expelled - and then black listed - to the point of neglecting potentially vital research on the U.S., and world, space effort. The situation is even more important because UT Austin is a lead institution not only for NASA but **the Department of Homeland Security**, and is in fact - with Bush as President - the lead research institution in America. It is baffling how so many serious violations of the law can be perpetrated against a decorated disabled veteran, in clear violation of every civil rights statute on the books.

Moreover, having sought help from every imaginable agency and authority, it is clear that the system is not working at all - not when a person must run as a candidate for President of the United States just to have proper attention directed to grievous flaws in research institutions that have a vital role in our **national defense**, our economic prosperity, and the war on terrorism.

Nazi's

A fundamental symptom of many mental disorders is the tendency to perceive controversies as black or white, with no middle ground. Our national leadership is being color blind on **Gun Control**. No sane person given the simple choice of "yes" or "no" would vote against gun control on these terms. Yet, if the issue is looked at in the full spectrum of possibilities no sane person would vote for gun control. Doing anything else would be the beginning of the end of the Bill of Rights, if not our entire democratic way of life.

The "right to bear arms" was a strong statement made in a violent world by brave men. They were determined to preserve the principles they had fought very hard to gain from an autocratic, authoritarian regime. That regime remains to this day, and by most standards the world is more violent than ever before. There is no reason why the right to bear arms would be any less important now than it was two hundred years ago.

The Constitution gives the American people a very simple way to change the law, by Amendment. Any other legislation concerning gun control sets a very dangerous precedent that could easily be invoked to revoke all of our other Constitutional rights. Thus, if guns are to be banned, they must be banned utterly and completely and for all time, everywhere. That is the only issue that can be

considered in this context. Understood?

There are peaceable uses for guns - in sports such as target or trap shooting, or just shooting at tin cans on a fence. There are several Olympic events using pistols or rifles, and they demand a high level of unique skills of the participants. Pure sport hunting of wildlife cannot be condoned at any level, but it can be regulated so to maintain population levels. In a wilderness that modern civilization has deprived of most natural predators, to do anything less for the passive creatures remaining would be cruel and wrong.

If guns were banned, these wildlife populations would still need to be controlled. Would you vote to pay federal or state employees to sport hunt as their job title? That is exactly what your vote for gun control would do. If our government cannot control wild fires, would they do any better with the far more pervasive and costly task of controlling wild life?

An integral aspect of gun control is the technology itself. There have for many years been easy ways to make guns safe from accidental discharge or use by minors. There are trigger guards, breech locks, and barrel locks. These extremely simple devices are easy to use and completely effective.

Guns have always been dangerous, and have been the cause of much crime in recent years. Why haven't manufacturers been using these safety devices for 20 or 30 years now? Why don't they as good corporate citizens install them on all weapons they sell now? Alas, why aren't rubber bullets available to the public for handguns - for that matter, why do manufacturers make any other kind of ammunition for handguns than rubber bullets?

We don't need gun control laws, we need manufacturer control laws. Look at Firestone. They knew for several years that one in ten of their Explorer tires would fail. Yet, they mass produced the tires anyway, endangering thousands of lives and millions of good jobs. We shouldn't be debating handgun concealment laws but "proof of conscience" labeling for all engineered products. Made in the U.S.A. used to be a guarantee of quality and longevity. Now it is a sign of deceit, corruption, and rank greed.

Just because a law does not exist does not mean manufacturers cannot do something conscionable. Or have profits become the driving force behind all modern corporate entities? A fifty cent breech lock would not look good on the bottom line; the

stockholders would panic and sell all their holdings. They must not realize that if the current sentiments on gun control continue they will not have any profits at all, or even a corporation to invest in. They seem to have become so gun shy they don't even want to remain in business, but are just having this "midnight special" going out of business hoopla.

Gun control advocates should visualize life without any guns at all. Those who are mentally disabled, for example, cannot by law own any firearm.

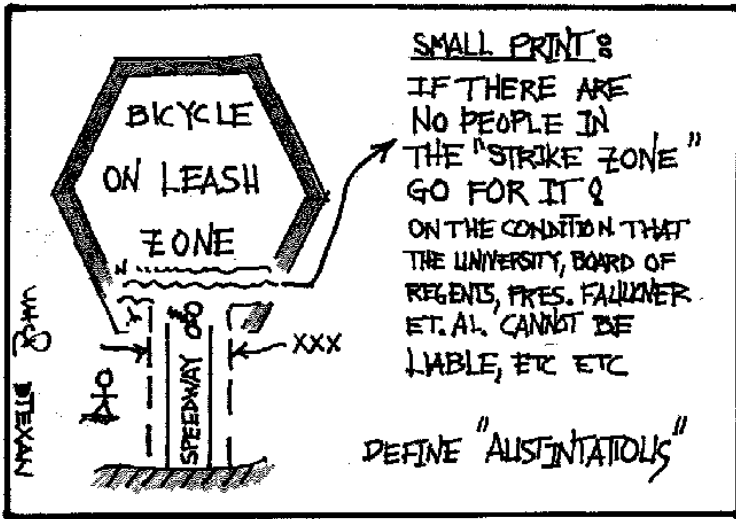
What they would see is a world with too few police to protect too many citizens from too many armed perpetrators. Freon

The millimeter thin Ozone Layer is rapidly deteriorating. Without it the only people to survive will be black people because their dark skin gives some protection against ultraviolet rays. NASA sent up a satellite to study the Ozone Layer in September 2001 but it was destroyed. You don't remember because of what happened on 9/11 earlier that month. NASA doesn't plan to send another satellite up. The ozone layer will be gone soon. White people will be extinct ~ rich, poor, or educated all the same. You don't suppose the destruction of that satellite right after lift off was an "act of terrorism" - NOT, because I've lobbied everybody from gutter to gable in Washington to get NASA to put another Freon study satellite in orbit. The worldwide Freon Ban was signed into law to reduce the deterioration of the ozone layer in the upper atmosphere. Ozone is what protects all life on Earth from the harmful affects of solar radiation - skin cancer for humans and other life forms, crop deterioration, and many other serious environmental affects.

Freon-12 decomposes ozone, thus making life on the Earth's surface defenseless. However, the ozone hole is five times larger

now than it was when the Freon Ban was passed.

The Freon Ban has cost an estimated \$1 trillion to date, predominantly in the replacement of large air conditioning devices called chillers. Every major building in the industrialized world has had to replace these systems. That's the law.

The new chillers, and all other refrigerating apparatus, operate at least 25% less efficiently using the new "zone friendly" freon. So, every air conditioned building in the world is paying at least 25% more for their utility bills, in addition to the typical six or seven figure cost of the new equipment itself.

In the years to come, additional types of freon will be phased in, each at a cost of \$1 trillion, and presumably each operating at a lower efficiency than the previous brand. The civilized nations of the world are willing and able to support this cost, if it does in fact save the ozone layer. Yet, what if refrigerants are NOT the culprit? What if we are paying these galactic sums and the environment is not helped at all?

The arguments against the Freon ban were once the gist of best selling expose books. These arguments are now more than that, but arguments to save our fragile environment and to spend the trillions of dollars in more productive ways.

There are many questionable issues about the efficacy of the Freon ban, and the role refrigerants actually play in the deterioration of the ozone layer. Any one of these issues would be justification to disallow the ban immediately, and to investigate the issues more thoroughly. Here are two of the more important issues:

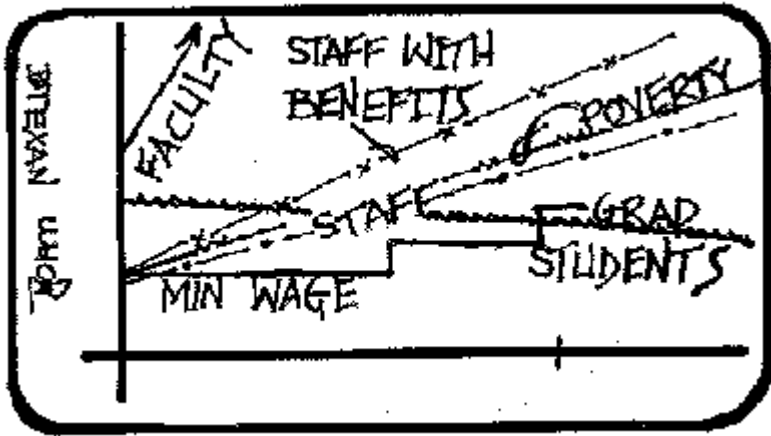
(1) Freon is four to ten times heavier than air. How can a gas so heavy make it fifteen miles into the thin upper atmosphere to damage the ozone layer?

(2) There are microbes in the soil that decompose Freon within 24 hours. How do they survive that? How can the Freon molecules make the 10,000 mile journey to the South Pole from the United States and the other major industrialized nations in the northern hemisphere that use most of the refrigerants?

NASA tried to send a satellite into orbit on September 20, 2001, specifically to study the ozone layer. The rocket exploded after launch, and NASA has no plans to put another satellite in orbit. The government evidently wants this whole issue to just go away. You

tell me ~ is National Security advisor Condoleeza Rice, the former Black Panther Islamic fundamentalist radical, a terrorist or what?

Senator Rock, I can explain. .

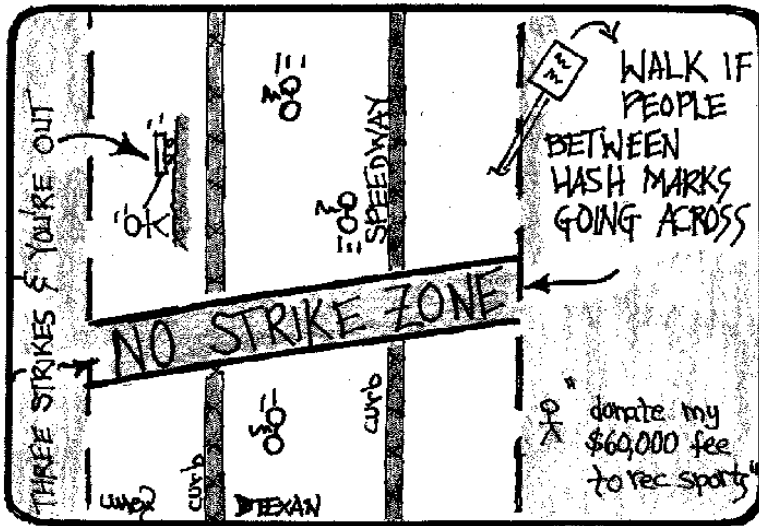

Following is a synopsis of a live interview with Reverend Scott Lewis, KTLV AM 1220 in Oklahoma City, OK on Sunday January 25th, 2003.

My guest tonight is William H. Clark II. He's written an autobiographical novel, called **Behold Leviathan**, published by Authorhouse Books.

(SL) Bill, the first thing that I'd like to know is, why I had such a hard time getting anybody with credentials to talk with me here tonight, and why is it you're willing to talk with me.

Scott, it's not that there isn't anything to talk about. The problem is that there's a regulation by the federal government that automatically revokes the security clearance of anybody who makes a public comment on any aspects of UFO's.

... My own use of the word "UFO's" is for "Unidentified Federal Outlays" ~ pertaining to the trillions of taxpayers money spent by the military industrial complex with absolutely no accountability.

(SL) Why is it you are here with me tonight?

For one thing, there have been hundreds of documented air traffic control problems caused by the proximity of unidentified aircraft. Nobody has investigated. As a Professional Engineer I have a responsibility to the public health, and an obligation to seek engineering answers to these engineering

problems. Incidentally, it's kind of interesting that most confirmed UFO sightings describe big orange or amber landing lights. Makes them sound kind of man made, doesn't it?

Other than that, I confess - I broke the law two years ago. I published a two part speculative Celestial Mechanics technical paper in one of the more respectable UFOlogy research journals. I didn't know about the government taboo against this. I even submitted these papers to my dissertation committee at the University because, after all, they WERE solid projects on applications of Celestial Mechanics that I have been working on for almost twenty years. I was expelled. It was really the only thing they could do, by law.

(SL) So you were dismissed for non academic reasons - your grades were good.. ?

I had a 3.8 GPA and had passed all the courses required for a Ph.D. in Celestial Mechanics. I'd also completed all the research. My project was an optimization of the Earth to Mars flight path. Given that five of the last seven missions to Mars had failed, it was an important topic, and I had important results. I found a faster, safer, more efficient mission profile. Moreover, the computer routine I created is for a ballistic trajectory. That's a trajectory with no thrusts except at the very beginning at lift off. This is just the problem that the military has spent billions to solve in the last thirty years as the Strategic Defense Initiative.

You may remember; President Regan called it the "Star Wars" missile defense program. Just last week the Bush Administration announced that they intend to implement SDI in full by 2004; and my research is probably the best in the world on this problem. But here I am, still unemployed, still fighting the system to get the Ph.D. I deserve. It really makes you wonder what the military is doing with the \$1 trillion allocated that project, and all the other "failed" projects ~ the superconducting supercollider, the Joint Task Force Fighter, and dozens more black projects that nobody has ever even heard about.

This trajectory analysis project of mine is a problem I've been associated with since the very beginning. I gave a formal presentation of my research in 1984 to the Post Commander and Chief Scientist when I was at White Sands; Major General Niles Fulwyler and Dr. Ralph Davies. White Sands is just where all the Star Wars research was being done, in particular on a chemical laser. It's still being done there, in fact.

Anyway, I made the mistake of researching topics beyond my official project on trajectories, and they expelled me for it. Those are the simple facts.

(SL) Have you appealed?

Yes, it's gone all the way through the University system ~ and quite a ways beyond. Let's see, I appealed to the Texas Board of Professional Engineers, accusing the Department of misrepresentation because they advertise a block of ten graduate courses in Celestial Mechanics in the Graduate Catalog and teach only one; and no longer offer a major in that area even though it's specified in the Catalog. I've petitioned the U.S. Department of Education Office of Civil Rights because I was expelled for participating in a protected activity - i.e. whistle blowing; and I even contacted ABET, the licensing authority for university engineering programs. My advisor stated in writing on University letter head that he quit as my advisor because I wrote to ABET ~ such retaliation is a violation of my civil rights. When all is said and done, even though most of my research has been accepted at major conferences; even though I have submitted dozens of letters from scientists supporting my work; all of this evidence is ignored.

(SL) I guess that means you won't get a job yourself with your new Masters Degree in Celestial Mechanics, then - especially now that you're talking with me on the air?

Yes, I'm sure you're right. But don't think I'm doing this for spite or to make an ugly scene. I'm in a corner. I can't get a job because nobody at the University will give me a reference; I can't get published because I have offended so many people in my field trying to get to the bottom of this whole UFO thing, so I don't have any choice left but to come out swinging with both fists. (Keep reminding your self that UFO means "Unidentified Federal Outlays ~ nothing more.)

However ~ it's a fight I'm well prepared for. I've spent the last ten years fighting what seems the whole world trying to promote energy conservation. I probably have the strongest credentials in that field of anybody in America - so I'm pretty tough. And, when this fiasco with UFO's tied my shoe laces together a couple of years ago, I wasn't about to do what they expected - to sit on my hands like some cowering graduate student, and meekly accept their killing my career. I've not stopped fighting since.

(SL) Bill, it's pretty clear the government is serious about keeping you silent about this whole issue - is there any reason for them to enforce this rule of silence? I'm NOT a believer; tell me something that will get me some reasonable doubt - not hearsay, but solid scientific facts. How about starting with the movie "Signs," and crop circles - the huge, intricate patterns that have been found in fields all over the world. Are they made by aliens?

No, my best guess is that Crop Circles are caused by gravity waves. The latest theory in astrophysics is that the universe is held together by strands of intense gravity. It's called "String Theory" and that is a good, literal description. I believe these strings get severed now and then, and when that happens they whip around and sometimes impact the Earth. I suspect Stonehenge was built three thousand years ago to preserve a record of ancient Crop Circles. I believe the parting of the Red Sea for Moses was caused by such an event. Does THAT help you to believe? And, I think crop circles are caused by these gravity strings . . . for the most part.

(SL) What do you mean, for the most part?

Well, I could generate most of the patterns you see in the crop circles using simple computer models of fundamental problems in Celestial Mechanics associated with what we call the Three Body Problem. Anything within a circle is possible to construct this way. It's the little elaborate designs around the perimeter that are the mystery to me. Like in the movie - the arrowheads, the little hats, all that stuff. I don't think they're natural, but man made to obfuscate the truth from the general public.

(SL) Why are there so many of these crop circles lately, all over the world?

I believe they're caused by significant changes in the Earth itself in recent years that have changed our position in this gravitational matrix. For example, the GPS - the Global Positioning System - depends upon atomic clocks to keep an extremely exact time, and they've added 1 extra second to the Earth's rotation rate about every year since the 1950's. Now, in just the last few years, no more "leap seconds" are having to be added. The Earth's rotation is speeding up. That may not seem like a big deal. But when you consider the mass of the Earth a change in rotation rate on that order is huge.

Clearly, the Earth's dynamic stability is changing. My theory is that it is caused by all the oil we're sucking out of the Earth. Oil is typically found in faults between rock formations. So, in effect we are taking the oil out of the hinges that make the planet flexible. I suspect this is what's causing the change in rotation rate. Sooner or later the earthquake victims are going to figure that out and sue the oil companies and probably the United States government for damages.

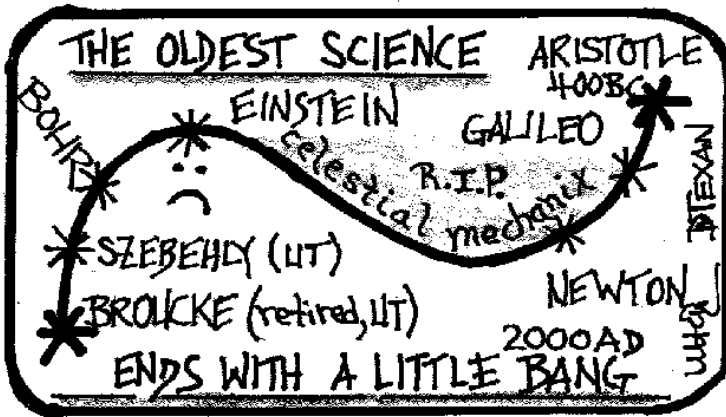
(SL) So these crop circles are made by huge gravity strings ~ kind of like what they show in the Star Gate TV show? Is there any connection?

" Relativity versus Celestial Mechanics - Relativity wins "

Science

Most people don't realize Celestial has explanations for all the phenomena physicists explain using Relativity Theory. In fact, Relativity Theory was first derived in the context of Celestial Mechanics, by the famous French mathematician Poincare in the late 1800's. Einstein arrived at the same results by a different approach several decades later. In the early 1900's when Einstein was doing his best work, there were literally thirty experts in Celestial Mechanics who were his equal intellectually; if not smarter. . . These brilliant men were deriving applications beyond Relativity Theory long before physicists ever heard of the word - and we've been ahead of the curve ever since!

We're the mysterious "dark force" that astronomers say is causing all the objects in the Universe to move apart at an accelerating rate. Sure, they're moving apart when studied in the context of Relativity Theory. In the much more structured, mathematically exact science of Celestial Mechanics, the Universe is stable - it's the speed of light, "c" that varies. If physicists have recently managed to slow light down to zero velocity, how can any rational person assume that it's velocity is fixed at the other end of the spectrum?

Be that as it may, there are many nice things about Celestial Mechanics. It is much less abstract ~ you will see that 90% of the material in my textbook on the Two Body Problem is basic geometry and trigonometry, and the rest is first year calculus. Celestial Mechanics is also far more generalized and with LOTS of room for more elaborate theories. We're still working on the

Three Body Problem (which has no solution in closed form); I have some material on the Ten Body Problem (i.e. the Sun + nine planets); and there are also some comments on the Many Body Problem, which reduces down to the equations for an incompressible fluid. (This was proven over 100 years ago and is generally accepted by all space scientists.)

Celestial Mechanics shows that space acts just like a fluid at velocities on the order of the speed of light, not like Relativity's brick wall. This is quite obvious in solid state physics, which studies electric current that goes at a high percentage of the speed of light. Relativistic affects have never been observed in electric circuits; hence the "Relativity Barrier" does not exist either physically or mathematically. As an example, satellites in Low Earth Orbit exhibit relativistic affects in their ninety minute orbits; yet, electric current going around the world in a second, has no relativistic component. What more proof do you need?

Electric current is the flow of electrons, each one going a little distance before it releases its charge to the next electron. They all move in a "conduction band" at near the speed of light. Does electric current going across a continent exhibit exponentially increased resistance, as Relativity says it should? No. Does the wire get much, much heavier, as Relativity says it should? No. Does the wire heat up - dissipating most of the electron's mass as energy - as Relativity says it should? No. Are scientists well aware of this paradox - do they strive to silence anybody who dares to speak of it? YES.
